Students repair and service the systems and components on light and heavy duty trucks and sports utility vehicles. Students are prepared for jobs in the auto/truck/heavy equipment industry. The class focuses on academic, technical skills, and employability practices. Students will develop personal and professional skills in the classroom that will transfer to the workplace:

- Use hand and power tools and test instruments
- Work alone and in small groups
