Students must park in designated areas only. No student parking is allowed in the visitor spaces (green zone-30 minute parking), emergency access (red curb areas), the bus circle, or the fire tower parking lot—at any time during school hours. Silicon Valley CTE students should refrain from parking in the Silicon Valley Adult Education parking lot areas as well. Student vehicles should not be left overnight unless permission is given.

A student’s parking privileges may be revoked should the student drive unsafely, disregard school staff’s instructions, or violate school rules.

Student Instructions:

As a SVCTE student, if you plan to drive and park a vehicle on our campus you may do so in lieu of riding the bus each day. This is a privilege and may be disqualified for the behavior reasons listed above. Parking is free of charge.

1. Fill out this form completely.
2. Cut this form at the dotted line. Keep the bottom half for yourself.
3. Turn the top half into Student Services (803) so a permit may be issued to you.
4. When a permit sticker is given to you, please place it on the inside windshield, lower right corner.
5. If you find some type of notice on your windshield, please come to the student services office (803).

Teacher Instructions:

SVCTE students should complete this form and turn the top half into the Student Services office (803). The form will be processed and a permit will be given to the instructor for the student to attach to their vehicle. The Law Enforcement students will monitor the student parking lot for permits.
