Purpose of Interim Reports

- Formal review of current year budget
- Multi-year Analysis of projected revenues, expenditures, and fund balances.
- Determination of the adequacy of fund balances at the end of the current and two subsequent years.
- Determination of the adequacy of cash balances at the end of the current and two subsequent fiscal years.
- Identification of contingent liabilities & resources to service those liabilities.
 - Board certification of financial condition.

Second Interim Report

• Based on budgetary status of District for period ending January 31, 2013.

 Governing Board must certify whether the District is able to meet its financial obligations for the current year and two subsequent years.

 The certification is classified Positive, Qualified, or Negative.

Major Current Year Changes

- Increased evening class fees
- Revised salary and benefit calculations
- Reduced insurance premiums

Significant Future Budget Impacts

 Due to the uncertainty of stable funding for the Adult Education Program the program is projected to run out reserves allowing students to complete their programs in the 2013/14 year terminating much of the Adult Education Program.

 With no Adult Education Program and no commitment to maintain Capitol High School, the projection assumes there will be no program for Capitol High School in 2013/14.

Major Multi-year Projection Changes

- Closing Capitol High School
- Phasing out Adult Ed w/shift to CCC
- Adjustments to WIA and Carl Perkins funding due to Sequestration



Personnel Reductions

- With a verbal commitment from San Jose Unified, there is an expectation that many of the lay off notices approved tonight will be rescinded or never issued, with the following exceptions:
- Adult Education staff impacted by loss of WIA funding and/or Carl Perkins.
- Capitol High School staff.
- Other reductions deemed necessary to reduce expenditures.
