



Dear Hocking Student:

Digital Copyright Safeguards is a Hocking College initiative that provides information regarding the proper use of digital copyrighted resources. This information is targeted to those who are provided access to Hocking information technology computer resources.

This initiative focuses on distributing relevant information via a multi-layered approach that includes:

- Education / Awareness – annual awareness emails to students outlining copyright safeguards with frequently asked questions.
- Legal Alternatives – includes information regarding free or low cost sites that offer music and other forms of digital media
- Technical Safeguards – including the use of a technology that allows legal use of peer to peer (P2P) at Hocking, while detecting attempts to obtain copyrighted content in violation of the DMCA. The Digital Copyright Safeguards web page provides a listing of the technical safeguards that will be implemented for a computer that is determined to be using P2P software to obtain illegal copyrighted materials.
- Notice to Students of Claimed Infringement – if a representative of copyrighted content (RIAA, MPAA, BSA, etc) detects illegal downloading or sharing of copyrighted content on the Hocking network, a letter of the alleged infringement will be sent to the university. In order to comply, the Office of Information Technology will forward the complaint to Student Affairs who will in turn notify the student of the complaint and if appropriate, disciplinary action will be initiated. Students are advised that unauthorized distribution of copyrighted material, including peer-to-peer file sharing may be subject to civil and criminal liabilities.
