GETTING STARTED: FINANCING YOUR DEGREE

1. Apply for admission and declare your major*
2. Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
Franklin's FAFSA school code is 003046
3. Complete a Community College Alliance Consortium Agreement if you would like to include hours at your community college
4. Complete the Outside Assistance Form (if applicable)
5. Apply for scholarships. For a comprehensive list of scholarships, visit franklin.edu/scholarships

* Steps 1 through 2 must be completed in order for financial aid to be processed.

Note: Do not submit your community college's school code for step 2 on the FAFSA if Franklin will be processing your financial aid.
