

Award Information and Application Instructions

Overview

Certification, in many ways, acts as a compass directing a nurse's clinical practice towards nationally accepted standards. Registered nurses who hold the CNOR credential, as well as facilities that support those nurses' certification goals, are subsequently committed to improving patient outcomes and look to certification to measure their mastery of the knowledge it takes to do so.

Thus, CCI developed the TrueNorth Award to recognize those organizations that use CNOR certification as a "true north" to guide their perioperative nursing staff to be lifelong learners, models of competent practice, and advocates for excellence and patient safety.

The Award

The TrueNorth Award consists of:

- \$1,500 for a celebratory reception to be held in conjunction with the award presentation.
- A commemorative recognition plaque.
- Five CNOR certification vouchers to be distributed by the winning organization at their discretion within 12 months from the award announcement.
- Onsite visit from the CEO of CCI and/or a member of the CCI Board of Directors who will personally present the TrueNorth Award for Certified Nurses Day.
- Press release and other CCI communication initiatives announcing the TrueNorth winner.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING NOMINATION APPLICATION

Eligibility: Healthcare organizations that employ CNOR certified nurses, or have certified nurses as members and/or representatives, are eligible to apply for this award. Organizations include but are not limited to:

- Hospitals
- Health systems
- Surgical services departments
- Ambulatory surgery centers
- AORN chapters

A unit or division of a larger organization is eligible to apply. Organizations that employ any member of the CCI Board of Directors or CCI staff are ineligible. Self-nominations are acceptable.

Steps to complete nomination submission:

- 1. Review application instructions
- 2. Gather letters of support from both the organization's Chief Nursing Officer (CNO) <u>and</u> Director of Surgical Services affirming the organization's commitment to specialty nursing certification *
- 3. Complete online application

Deadline: Nominations must be submitted online by 11:59 pm on November 1, 2017.

Selection Committee: An independent selection committee appointed by the President of the CCI Board of Directors will choose the award recipient.

Category 1 - Workforce Statistics (20 points)

Perioperative Nursing Staff

Category 2 - Letters of Endorsement (10 points)

Evidence will be in the form of scanned PDF documents submitted as attachments to the application. Suggestion for further detail regarding the material to be covered in each letter is included within the scoring rubric.

- 1. Letter from CNO that is specific in its content supporting certification in perioperative services
- 2. Letter from Manager or Director of Surgical Services that is specific in its content supporting certification in perioperative services

Category 3 – Rewards and Recognition (30 points)

Suggestion for further detail regarding the material to be covered in each category is included within the scoring rubric.

Category 3A - Evidence of Recognition – 7 points

A written description that delineates recognition activities for certified nurses. This section is limited to 500 words of text. Text that exceeds the word limit will not be scored.

Category 3B - Organizational Recognition – 7 points

A written description of measures or programs that exist at your facility to support certified nurses. This section is limited to 500 words of text. Text that exceeds the word limit will not be scored.

Category 3C -Perioperative Department Recognition-7 points

A written description of programs and structures in place to support certified nurses. This section is limited to 500 words of text. Text that exceeds the word limit will not be scored.

Category 3D - Demonstration of Expertise by Certificants – 5 points

A written description of the achievements of certified nurses. This section is limited to 500 words of text. Text that exceeds the word limit will not be scored.

Category 3E – Other Achievements – 4 points

A written description of any other activity related to the promotion of certification or the recognition of certified nurses may be included in this category. This section is limited to 500 words of text. Text that exceeds the word limit will not be scored.

Category 4 – Impact of Certification (40 points)

A written description of how certification has produced positive change within the facility. This description should address the processes, implementation methods, and results achieved as a result of the work of certified nurses. The emphasis is on measurable outcomes. Trends and comparisons to external and internal benchmarks will help to substantiate the achievements.

The emphasis here is on the "So what" of your certification efforts. The intent of this section is to answer the question - How are these certified nurses applying their knowledge and expertise to effect positive change in patient and nursing outcomes? This section is limited to 1000 words.

NOTE: all activities and accomplishments listed in the application must be dated after January 1, 2014.
