Prof. Karen Vickery

Professor Vickery is Scientific Director of the Surgical Infection Research Group, and Vice-Chancellor Innovation Fellow at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Macquarie University, Sydney Australia

Professor Vickery has been at the forefront of research into detecting biofilm associated with breast implant failure, as well as endoscope and environmental surface decontamination failures. Her research aims to prevent Healthcare Associated Infections by focusing on both surgical strategies for preventing biofilm infection of medical implants, treating biofilm infections of chronic wounds and strategies that improve instrument and environmental decontamination. Her expertise in decontamination has led to membership of expert advisory committees for the Australian Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA), GENCA and Standards Australia.



Dr. Ruth Carrico

Associate Professor with the University of Louisville School of Medicine in the Division of Infectious Diseases

Dr. Carrico has received training specific for healthcare epidemiology at the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in conjunction with the Rollins School of Public Health at Emory University in Atlanta, and the Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA).

Dr. Carrico has authored and co-authored numerous peer reviewed manuscripts and has served as the editor since 2005 for the Association for Professionals in Infection Control along with Epidemiology's Text of Infection Control and Epidemiology, the primary textbook for Infection Preventionists used worldwide. She currently serves as a reviewer for the American Journal of Infection Control, Infection Control and Hospital Epidemiology, Critical Care Medicine and the American Journal of Public Health among others. Dr. Carrico has also served on the APIC National Board of Directors and currently serves as AHE's Clinical Advisor.

Fiona is the past president of the AHE, the winner of 2015 Environmental Services Departments of the Year, and is also known as America's leading Environmental Services Manager.

His focus has been on the prevention of Healthcare-Associated and Community-Associated infection prevention and control and is widely recognised as an expert in Infection Prevention, Infectious Disease, Global Health, Healthcare Epidemiology, Environmental Services, Disinfection, Hand Hygiene, Vascular Access, Nursing, Food Safety, Patient Safety, Medical Affairs, and Emergency Preparedness.


