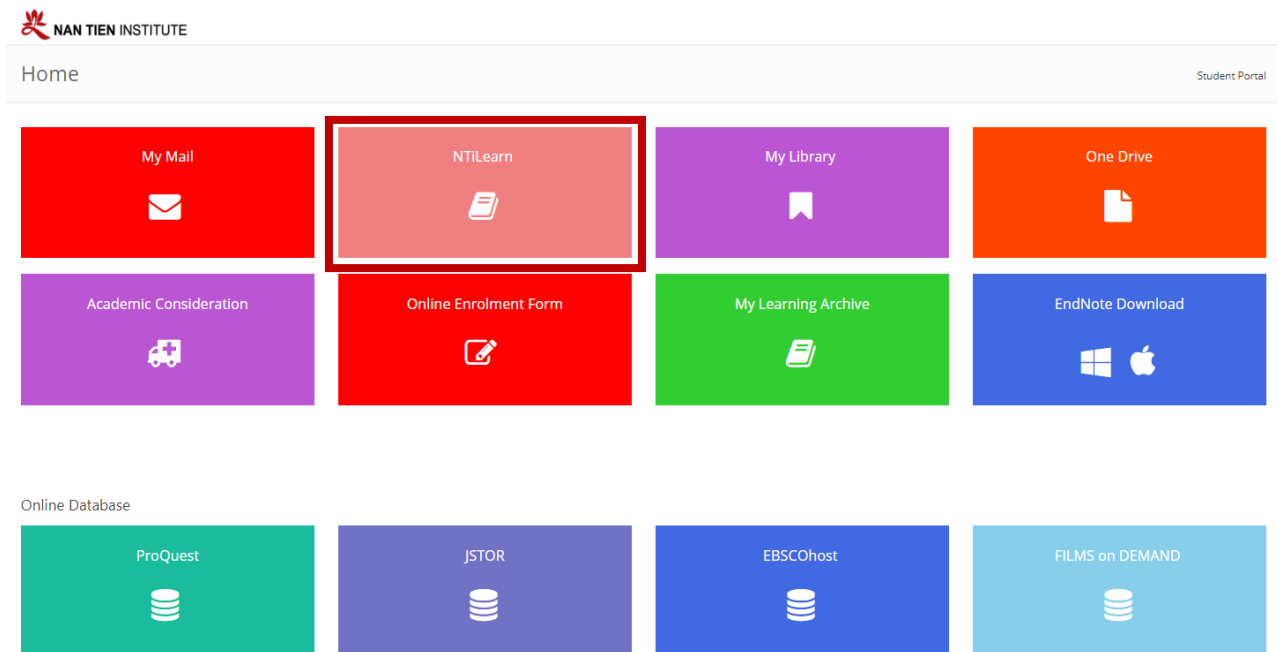
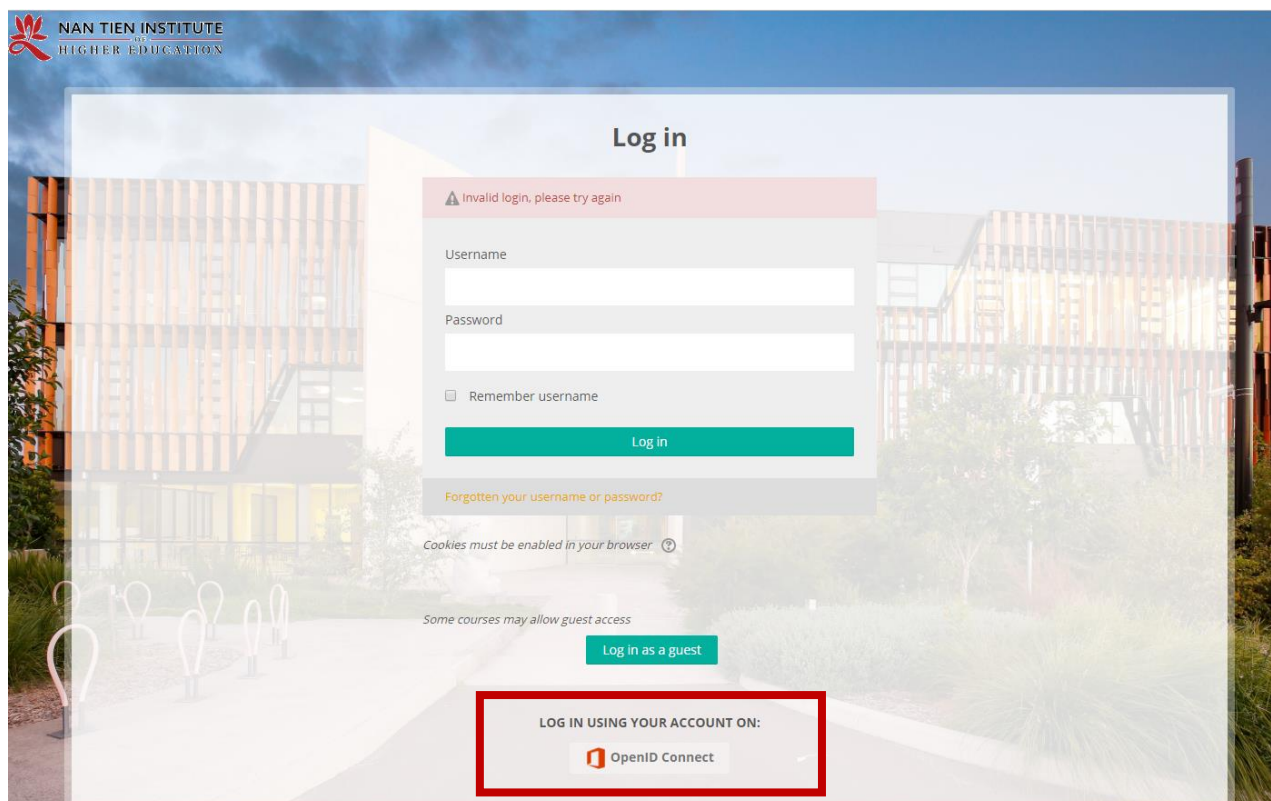


Navigating NTiLearn

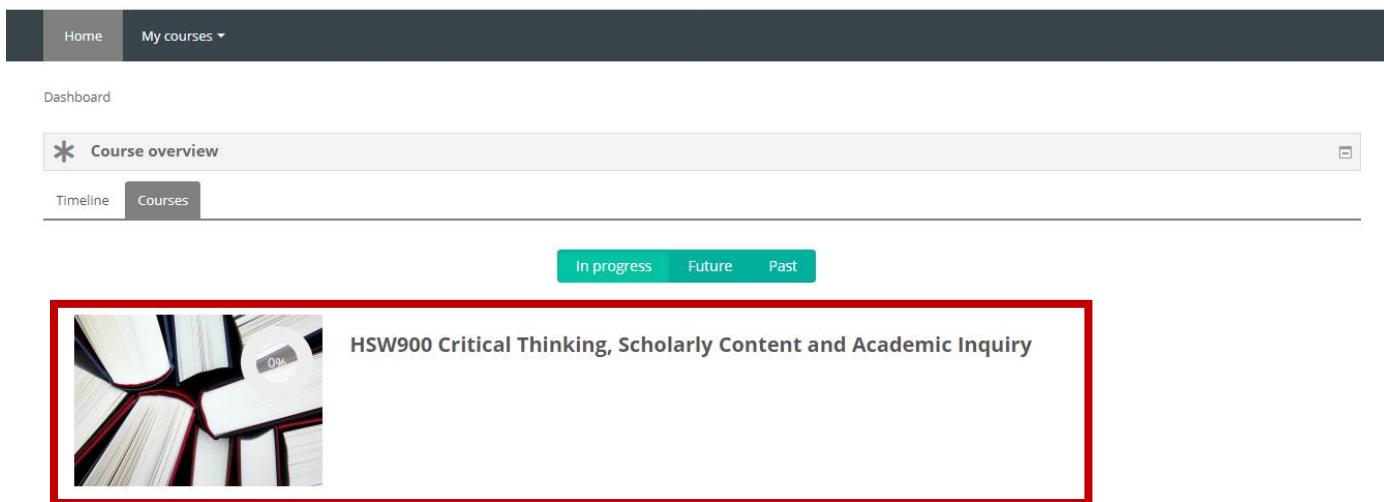
1. To access NTiLearn, click on the link within the Student Portal. This link allows automatic sign-on to NTiLearn (you are not required to re-enter your login details)



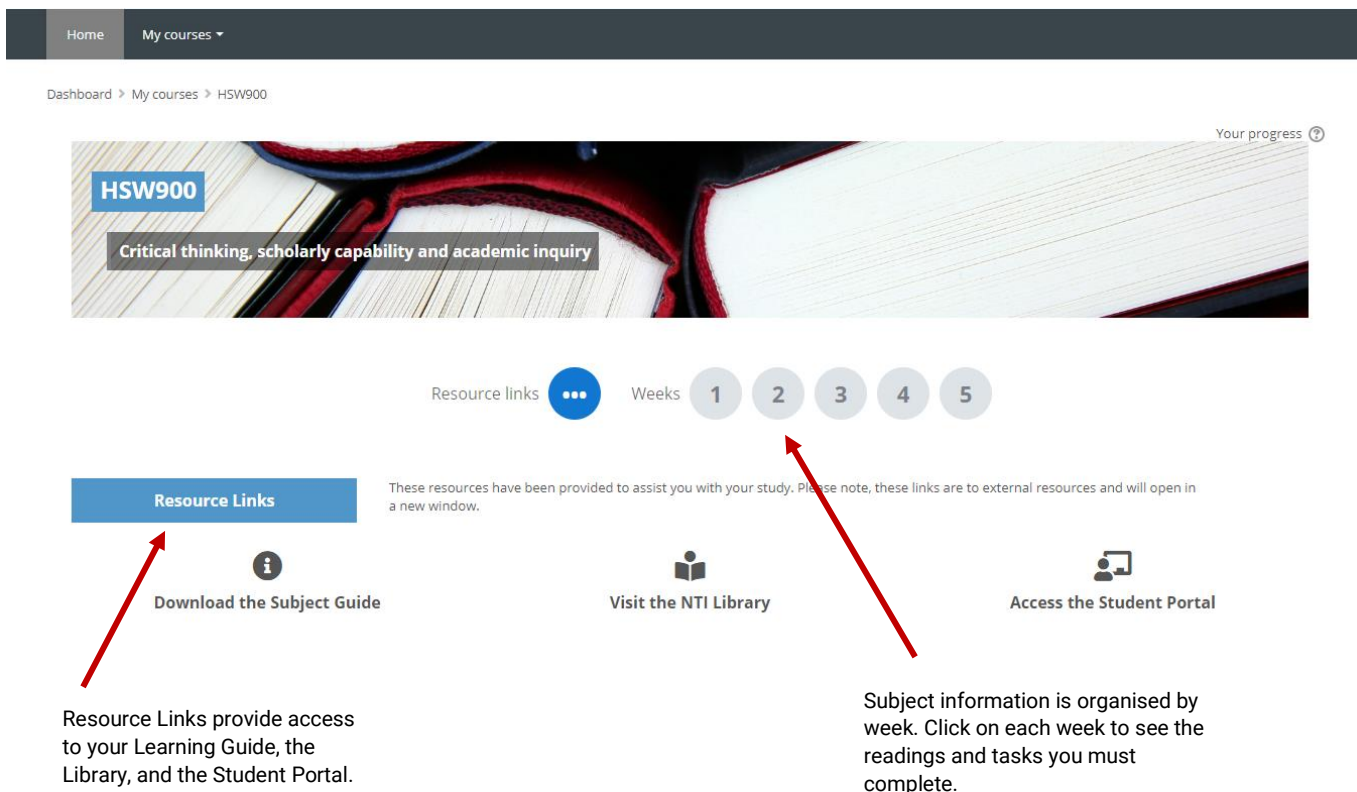
2. If you are logged out of NTiLearn, click on the **OpenID Connect** button at the bottom of the login page for automatic sign-on (you are not required to enter your login details).



3. The home page of **NTiLearn** displays the courses/subjects you are currently enrolled in. To enter a particular subject, click on the subject name.



4. Within each subject, you can find resources relevant to your studies. Click on the **Resource Links** button for quick access to important resources.
