SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION

- The Workforce and Education Chair introduced Tim Rodden of the DCHI Patient & Consumer Advisory Committee as a public attendee. Per the new

Patient & Consumer Advisory Committee structure, Tim and others will attend Workforce and Education Committee meetings to listen for the inclusion of the patient and consumer perspective in appropriate initiatives.

- A representative from Tapp Network provided an update on the DCHI Communications Plan and shared screenshots of the Workforce and Education Committee section of the DCHI website, which is currently under development. A soft launch is scheduled for February before a complete launch of the revised DCHI website in March.
- Committee members were updated on the following initiatives: graduate health professional education consortium, health care workforce learning and re-learning curriculum, and the Community Health Worker working group.
- The DCHI Executive Director recapped the discussion from the February DCHI Board meeting and informed Committee members the year three operational plan has been approved by CMMI.
- Committee members recapped conversation from the January meeting on implementing the Committee's licensing and credentialing recommendations and discussed approaches in other states to guide reform efforts in Delaware. Committee members requested lessons learned and best practices from states which have contracted with a single credential verification organization.
