SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION

- Workforce and Education Committee members were briefed on updates from the November DCHI Board meeting, including information on the DCHI communications plan and the recent strategic planning initiative aimed to examine long-term sustainability beyond the end of the grant period.
- Committee members then received an update from the November DCHI Cross-Committee meeting, which included a deep dive and breakout session on the Health Care Workforce Learning and Re-Learning Training Curriculum. It was noted that the new format of the breakout sessions were well received and that the presentations from two payers and an Accountable Care Organization on value-based payment models were beneficial.
- Christiana Care Health System is scheduling interviews in the coming weeks to round out the staffing plan for the Graduate Health Professional Education Consortium. Meanwhile, Module 1 of the Health Care Workforce Learning and Re-Learning Training Curriculum will launch in January.

- The Committee then spent the balance of meeting time reviewing the first draft of the consensus paper on developing a sustainable workforce capacity assessment. The edits and feedback discussed during the meeting will be incorporated into a second version, which will be circulated in advance of the December Committee meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- One public attendee noted that the Joint Finance Committee will be holding meetings next week regarding the future of DIMER and DIDER. Historical information on both DIMER and DIDER should be included in the consensus paper. Finally, the recently developed open data portal should be examined for inclusion in the consensus paper and the vendor's work moving forward.
- Another public attendee indicated the increased demand for a communication resource guide. The Division of Public Health recently contracted with Health Management Associates to develop a Community Health Worker plan. Health Management Associates will work in conjunction with the DCHI Committees. The ultimate vision is to have Community Health Workers deployed with electronic access to information on available resources.

- Update the draft consensus paper with Committee feedback and circulate by Friday, November 18th.
- Finalize the consensus paper during the December Committee meeting.
