HUD Launches LSHR Training and Resources Webpages

In an email yesterday to the <u>HUD Exchange mailing list</u>, HUD's Office of Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes (<u>OLHCHH</u>) announced that it has launched training and resources webpages to help users review federal lead regulations and the lead safe housing rule (<u>LSHR</u>) amendment for pre-1978 housing. The purpose of these webpages is to help PHAs, grantees, and owners to respond to cases of elevated blood lead levels (EBLLs) in children under six living in federally assisted housing.

On the <u>LSHR training webpage</u>, users can access two webinars that are focused on different programs types: tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA), public housing, and project-based assistance (PBA). The webinars provide:

- A review on rules and requirements concerning lead safe work practices
- A description and discussion on the scope, requirements, and key definitions of the LSHR amendment
- An overview of available resources
