HUD Allocates More than \$75 Million in Fourth Wave of CARES Act Funding

In a [press release](#) yesterday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ([HUD](#)) announced that it has allocated nearly \$77 million in a fourth wave of COVID-19 relief funding implemented under the CARES Act. This wave of funding, provided through HUD's Section 811 [Mainstream Housing Choice Voucher Program](#), supports up to 8,300 additional vouchers, which will provide affordable housing to non-elderly people with disabilities. This is the fourth round of funding since President Trump signed the CARES Act into law. The first round allocated over \$3 billion to assist communities and nonprofits to help protect the homeless, Americans with compromised immune systems, and tribal communities in their COVID-19 response efforts. The second wave of funding was intended to help low-income Americans living in public housing. A third round was made to help communities improve their coronavirus response and relief efforts.
