

# Boerne ISD Receives 73%+ Approval on \$175M Bond Referendum - Using Data Analytics Has Significant Impact

### THE SITUATION

Nestled in Texas Hill Country, Boerne Independent School District (ISD) has increased student enrollment 19% over the last five years. This fast-growth school district is busting at the seams – literally. Currently, two of the district's five elementary schools are over capacity. In just a few short years, the middle schools and high school will also exceed capacity. With a projected annual growth rate of 5%, Boerne ISD knew it had to do something to accommodate the growing enrollment and alleviate the current overcrowding issues, but also address future capacity issues and provide equity for evolving and growing student programs. With a bond referendum necessary to address these important needs, there was a vast amount of data preparation to be completed in order to present a compelling story that would gain approval. For Assistant Superintendent of Business and Finance Tish Grill and her colleagues, this process is not only time consuming, but daunting.

Boerne Independent School District (ISD), nestled in the scenic Texas Hill Country, is a "destination district" for families who enjoy Boerne's unique combination of rural roots, small town atmosphere and easy access to America's seventh largest city – vibrant San Antonio.

The community places a high priority on education and has built a reputation for excellence that has been sustained through the years. Just over 8,300 students attend class at five elementary schools, two middle schools, two high schools and an alternative campus.

### THE SOLUTION
