PLEASE READ How to Use this Activity Packet

Step 1: Print pages 4 - 29 to leave with residents. This can be done with or without step 2, however we highly recommend watching one of our on-demand recordings with a resident, before leaving this boredom buster with them.

Materials for each kit:

- 1 foot of a panty hose (any color / size) or a thin sock (Cut hose into socks)
- 2 pipe cleaners (your choice of colors yellow, white, purple, green, pink, red, blue, green, etc.) and 2 googly eyes (large work best)
- Glue stick
- 2 cups of sand (any type of sand to fill the panty hose)
- 1-2 tsp quick growing grass seed (whatever you have on hand)





Grass Heads!








Step 1: Take out your pre-packaged materials. Add grass seeds to the bottom then fill with sand or dirt. Tie off.

Step 2: Use glue and materials to make a face. Bonus if you can make it look like Dad-did he wear glasses? Hats often? Create away! Pipe cleaners can be used to make glasses, smiles, bow ties and more.

Step 3: Dip the head in water and place in a sunny window sill. Wait about 5 days for growth

Step 4: Water as needed, and watch as the grass begins to grow hair!



Cars of the 1960s



Ford Mustang

The Ford Mustang was unveiled at the World's Fair in New York in 1964, and that same day nearly 22,000 Mustangs were purchased across showrooms in America. The Ford Mustang is named after a World War II fighter plane and is often seen as the working man's Thunderbird. Igniting a revolution among car ownership, the Mustang sold nearly 300,000 "Stangs" in its first year, nearly overwhelming production lines. The starting price? \$2,368.




Chevy Camaro

You can't mention a Ford Mustang without also mentioning its GM competitor, the Chevy Camaro. The Camaro was a rush job (taking just over 2 years from creation to production to the sales floor) by GM to compete against the ludicrously successful Ford Mustang. While the 1967 Camaro only sold about half of what Ford Mustang sold in its first year, where the Camaro really gained traction was in its street cred for racing. Determined to prove its credentials, GM created the Trans-Am race car, the car Mark Donohue would race in. Donahue went on to win 3 times in 1967, and with a slight remodel (redecorated as a 1968) he went on to win 10 out of 13 races for the season, solidifying Camaro's as superior to Mustangs in racing.



VW Beetle

Although the Beetle had been around since the 1930s, the "Bug" became a symbol of the 1960s. In 1959, the Beetle became iconic of "thinking small", a slogan created by the New York advertising agency, Doyle Dan Bernbach. This campaign would later be named it the best advertising campaign of the 20th century by Ad Age. By 1968, Beetles were commonplace in American households as Disney released its famous line of movies, Herbie the Love Bug. By 1972, The Beetle passed the Ford Model T as the best-selling car of all time. The last VW Beetle was produced in 2019.



Pontiac GTO

The brainchild of the Pontiac division of General Motors (GM), the GTO was born to challenge the Chevrolet branch of the company for superiority within GM line of automobiles. Early in 1963, GM internally banned divisions from involvement in auto racing, a key selling point for Pontiac. Because Pontiac was heavily focused on performance, and was an important part of the marketing strategy, Jim Wagners and chief engineer John De Lorean, came up with a solution. They transformed "The Tempest" an upcoming model into a "Super Tempest" by adding the larger Pontiac V8 engine from the fill-sized Pontiac Catalina in place of the standard Tempest V8. The name has roots in auto racing, being both inspired by the Ferrari 250 GTO and by the acronym itself which stands for "Gran Turismo Omologato", Italian for racing in GT class.


