#### 1. Honor Societies

Since the Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship seeks the most academically talented community college students in the nation, colleagues and students involved with honor societies on your campus are great individuals to reach out to. Some examples include <u>Phi Theta Kappa</u> and other discipline interests' honor societies such as <u>Alpha Beta Gamma</u> (International Business Honor Society).

#### 2. The Honors College & Students on the Dean's/Honor List

Similarly to honor societies, the most academically talented students at your college may be members of the honors college at your institution. Reaching out to a couple of professors in the department would be advantageous to potentially discovering the next Cooke Scholar at your campus since they closely work with high-achieving students in the academic setting. If your college does not have an honors college, informing students on the dean's/honor list is also a great way to perform outreach.

### 3. Leadership Organizations

Similarly to many other scholarships, the Cooke Foundation is seeking students with exemplary leadership. Leadership and the desire to help others are important qualities the foundation screen for in applicants. Student leaders in Student Government Associations, community service organizations, and honor societies are great students to reach out to.
