his is the second year St Andrew's choir students are participating in the University of Victoria's pilot project to improve the quality of life for people living with dementia.

Voices in Motion is an inter-generational choir composed of people living with dementia, their care-givers and St Andrew's choir students. Through the unifying power of music, they encounter those with dementia not as "patients" but as fellow human beings with unique stories to tell. In addition to singing, time is also given to sharing



personal life experiences, which has a great impact on students and helps to remove the stigma around the disease.

Our school choir, the **St Andrew's Singers**, reaches out to the community by singing at special

### **WORLD FOOD DAY**

In October, we celebrated Thanksgiving by bringing awareness and relief to our community in need. St Andrew's students collected over 900 items of non-perishable food and delivered them to the St Vincent de Paul Social Concern Office. In addition, they lead the way for our three partner schools. St Andrew's students accompanied elementary students from St Patrick's and St Joseph's elementary schools on their annual World Food Day Awareness Walk and helped the students of Christ Church Cathedral School carry their donations to St Vincent's. We are thankful that our students are so willing to assist in efforts to bring food and comfort to those in need, and for being role models to the younger students.



### FIELD TRIP TO BMSC

In October, a group of Grade 11 and 12 students spent three exciting days at the **Bamfield Marine Sciences** Centre (BMSC). By day, students spent time DNA barcoding and studying invertebrates in the lab; collecting plankton by boat; observing sea lions; learning about the rich Indigenous history of the area; and hiking to Brady's beach to study invertebrates in situ. By night, they delighted in the bioluminescence display put on by a multitude of dinoflagellates. The whole experience to BMSC was both fun and educational!
