

Como

Founded by the Romans in 196 B.C., Como has been internationally known for its silk-weaving industry since silkworms were first imported here in the 14th century. At one time, Como was the largest European silk producer—dyeing, weaving and designing fabrics to be shipped to the fashion houses of Milan, Paris and London. Enjoy ideally located accommodations for the entire week in the PALACE HOTEL on the shores of Lake Como and in the *centro storico* (old town) of this charming Italian *città*. Walk along cobblestone passages past medieval towers and walls, Renaissance palaces and churches, neoclassical 19th-century villas and small family-owned *negozi* (shops) leading to the Piazza Cavour and the tranquil lakeside promenade. See the magnificent Duomo di Como, considered to be the most beautiful cathedral in Lombardy—it took nearly 400 years to complete and reflects a seamless blend of Gothic and Renaissance styles.

CULTURAL ENRICHMENTS: A local scholar presents a private lecture about Como from the Roman era to the present, and local art historian and resident Giuseppina Lucini presents exclusive lecture. During the exclusive VILLAGE LIFE® FORUM, residents will discuss contemporary life in the extraordinarily beautiful and historic Italian Lake District.



Isola Bella is the most spectacular of the Borromean Islands, located on the Italian side of Lake Maggiore. Visit a magnificent 16th-century villa and stroll through one of the most beautiful gardens in the world.



Along the stunning shoreline of Lake Como, the picturesque village of Bellagio is comprised of many traditional patrician houses and villas that are surrounded by lush parks with fragrant gardens and poplar trees.

Savor the delights of northern Italian cuisine while enjoying dinner in a local *ristorante*. During time on your own, peruse the fresh fruit and vegetables in the three-times-weekly outdoor market, a local tradition for centuries.

Lago Maggiore

Italy's second-largest lake forms a natural boundary between the regions of Lombardy and Piedmont and is a close rival to Lake Como as the most spectacular in the Italian Lake District. Lake Maggiore's mild climate allows gardens to grow rare and exotic plants in the beautiful landscape beneath the high Alps, particularly on the remarkable Borromean Islands. Enjoy a private boat cruise across the deep, clear waters and amidst its charming islands that served as inspiration for Flaubert, Wagner and Goethe.

Borromean Islands

Cruise among Lake Maggiore's enticing islands graced with elegant villas and striking natural beauty. Isola Bella, Isola di San Giovanni, Isola Madre and Isola dei Pescatori are collectively known as the Borromean Islands, named after the powerful and influential Borromeo family. Visit the exquisitely preserved Isola Bella, commissioned by Count Carlo Borromeo III in 1632 as a magnificent Baroque retreat dedicated to his wife, Isabella.

CULTURAL ENRICHMENT: Walk through Isola Bella's splendid Italianate gardens, where white peacocks stroll among the seasonal blaze of roses, gardenias, azaleas and rhododendrons. Tour the 17th-century Palazzo Borromeo, filled with priceless masterpieces by such artists as Tiepolo and the sculptor Canova, and see the spectacular grotto, decorated entirely with mosaics of marine life.

Stresa

An 18th- and 19th-century "Grand Tour" of Europe was considered incomplete without a visit to Stresa to experience its spectacular mountain views, tropical gardens and the resplendent glistening waters of Lake Maggiore. A young Ernest Hemingway, recuperating in Stresa during World War I, was inspired to make it the setting for Frederic Henry and Catherine Barkley's reunion in *A Farewell to Arms*.

Milan

Recognized as the capital of the design and fashion worlds, Milan has an ancient cultural heritage and legacy that blends its ornately preserved palaces, churches and museums with vibrant contemporary life, an abundance of haute cuisine, art and operatic traditions. Visit the world-famous Teatro alla Scala opera house and Milan's exquisite Duomo.

CULTURAL ENRICHMENT: By special arrangement, visit the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Santa Maria delle Grazie to experience the genius and beauty of Leonardo da Vinci's renowned masterpiece, *The Last Supper*.

Lago di Como

Composer Franz Liszt romanticized, "When you write the story of two happy lovers, place them on the shores of Lake Como." Cruise by private boat across the sparkling waters of Italy's deepest—and perhaps most spectacular—lake and learn more about its fascinating history and allure as you pass in front of the quaint coastal village of Bellagio and grand Renaissance villas, built on the slopes of snowcapped mountains.

Villa del Balbianello

Just across Lake Como from Bellagio is the exquisite Villa del Balbianello and its magnificent terraced gardens. Built in 1787 by Cardinal Angelo Maria Durini, this epitome of an Italian lake villa was renovated in the early 20th century by an American veteran of World War I and more recently purchased by Italy's first explorer to summit Mt. Everest, Guido Monzino, who bequeathed it to the Italian National Trust.



Milan's awe-inspiring Gothic-style Duomo is crowned with monumental, intricate spires and is home to some of Italy's finest religious art.

THE PALACE HOTEL

The recently refurbished, classic belle-époque PALACE HOTEL is a delightful establishment with a magnificent setting on the *lungo lago* (lakefront promenade) overlooking Lake Como and is just steps away from Como's beautiful marble Duomo and the medieval, pedestrian-only town center. Venetian stucco artistry, Italian marble and antique furniture provide subtle touches of 19th-century elegance throughout the hotel, while its beautifully landscaped gardens provide the perfect setting to admire enchanting views across Lake Como. The Ceccato Ice Cream Parlor, with its summer terrace and winter garden overlooking the lake, is an excellent place to enjoy the refreshing flavors of a traditional Italian ice or a cup of cappuccino.



Each of the hotel's 94 comfortable guest rooms is tastefully appointed with a private bathroom, air conditioning, satellite television, minibar and hair dryer. Meals feature well-prepared Italian and local specialties and international cuisine. Table wines are served with dinner. The hotel staff provides exceptional service.

It remains an authentic Italian villa masterpiece and repository of 18th-century French and English furniture, and Monzino's collection of Chinese, pre-Columbian and African art.

Bellagio

Perched on a promontory punctuated by stands of cypress trees, Bellagio is one of the Italian Lake District's most internationally well-known communes and has been a popular European holiday destination since Roman times. In the 18th and 19th centuries, Milanese nobility flocked here to build elaborate villas and cultivate subtropical gardens.

Lago d'Orta

Nestled in the captivating Piedmont region of northwestern Italy, tranquil, glittering Lake Orta is one of the Lake District's best-kept secrets. Enjoy a walking tour to the heart of Orta San Giulio's lovely medieval village center, replete with cobblestone lanes that open up to a picturesque piazza; rich, ochre-hued houses fronted by decorative wrought-iron balconies; and attractive palazzos, once home to Italian nobility. Enjoy time at leisure this beautiful village.

CULTURAL ENRICHMENT: Atop the summit of Sacro Monte di Orta—one of nine sacred mountains in northern Italy and a UNESCO World Heritage site—amidst a picturesque landscape of forested hills, visit several small chapels dedicated to St. Francis of Assisi, decorated with elaborate frescoes and built between the 16th and 18th centuries.

Isola San Giulio

Cruise across cobalt-blue Lake Orta in a private boat to diminutive Isola San Giulio, taking in spectacular views of picture-perfect Italian villas and gardens along the way. This intimate island served as artistic inspiration to Robert Browning, Honoré de Balzac and Lord Byron, who all wrote of its sublime beauty. Visit the 12th-century Romanesque-style Basilica San Giulio, whose opulent interior is decorated with richly detailed frescoes painted upon the nave, chapel, vaults and aisles, and stroll the lush grounds of its monastery and old-world villas.



Tesori di Verona e Venezia

Discover the delightful treasures of two beloved Italian locales—fair Verona and extraordinary Venice. A vibrant Roman and medieval trading center, Verona is the legendary setting for Shakespeare's timeless romance and tragedy, *Romeo and Juliet*, and a UNESCO World Heritage site. The town is renowned for its well-preserved Romanesque and Gothic cathedrals, delightful piazzas and magnificent Roman monuments. See the spectacular 2000-year-old Roman Arena—the third-largest such edifice in the world, still in use today—and star-crossed Juliet's famous balcony.

In Venice, tour this UNESCO World Heritage site and architectural masterpiece, including the Gothic-style Doge's Palace. Visit the charming archipelago of Burano, known for its colorful houses and fishing boats and for skilled lace-making artisans. Accommodations for three nights are in the elegant HOTEL BONVECCHIATI, an 18th-century palazzo ideally located just a short walk from Venice's famous Piazza San Marco.
