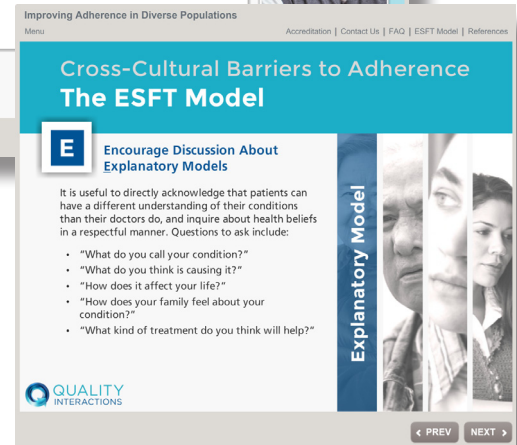
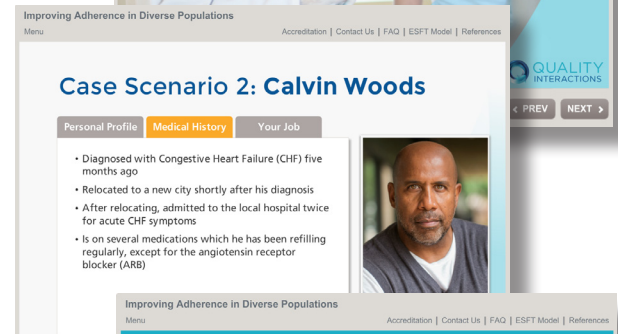
About This Course
