

What we have found goes beyond the typical approval ratings and public opinion

In looking at gender, age, or geographic region we are seeing a poor reputation







Key Leadership Lessons Learned for CEOs • Managing your **personal reputation** as a leader is key to driving universal support — what you do, say, and are

- deliver on promises. • Lead by example and **model behavior** — set the standards for the ideal corporate culture you want
- to embrace. • There's a **goldilocks effect of communicating** — not too much communicating, nor too little, just right (rant tweeting doesn't help).
- Lead in a way that's authentic a little humility and empathy goes a long way to creating an appealing persona.
