

COVID-19 Unemployment Benefits

Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC)

Individuals can receive an additional 13 weeks of unemployment benefits after they exhaust their state benefits. Most states offer 26 weeks of UI so eligible employees can receive up to 39 weeks of unemployment benefits.

Paid Family Leave (PFL)

If you are unable to work because you are caring for an ill or quarantined family member with COVID-19 (certified by a medical professional) file a claim at:

Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)

Emergency unemployment assistance to workers who have either exhausted their state unemployment benefits or who do not have access to regular state Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits. Eligible individuals include self-employed workers, independent contractors, freelancers, those looking for part-time work and workers who don't have the work history to qualify for state UI. Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (PUC)

Through EDD the federal government will pay an additional \$600 on top of current weekly benefit amount as part of the CARES Act. The \$600 extra payments can continue through the week ending July 31, 2020.

Unemployment Insurance (UI)

If your employer has reduced your hours or shut down operations due to COVID-19 you can file a claim at https://www.edd.ca.gov/Unemployment/Filing_a_Claim.htm

If your child's school is closed, and you have to miss work to be there for them you can file for *Unemployment Insurance (UI)* to see if you are eligible
