HEBSV's FREE HUD approved one-on-one Housing Counseling Program offers individualized guidance from a Habitat Housing Counselor, geared toward strategies for financial health and preparation for homeownership, in light of each client's unique housing and financial circumstances. Services include prepurchase, credit, and budget counseling.

#### **Home Preservation and Repair Program**

Habitat's Home Repair Program preserves homeownership for low-income residents while alleviating critical health and safety concerns. With our skilled construction staff and the enlisted help of volunteers, qualified homeowners can find help with a variety of interior and exterior repairs. Partnering homeowners are left with a new sense of pride and the ability to enjoy their homes for years to come.

#### **Affordable Homeownership Program**

We provide affordable homeownership opportunities to qualifying households, earning up to 80% of the Area Median Income, in Alameda, Contra Costa, and Santa Clara counties. To qualify, you must show a need for housing, be willing to partner with Habitat by contributing sweat equity in the construction of your home, and demonstrate the ability to pay.
