Cloud Computing Benefits

You may be wondering how the cloud can benefit you in ways beyond video sharing and email. Below is a list of the top ten benefits of cloud computing:

- 1. Easy Access** - Get your files at any time, from anywhere with internet access
- 2. Flexibility** - Use and only pay for what you need. Most providers offer different levels of service.
- 3. Offsite Storage** - Your critical files are safe if anything were to happen to your computer or workspace.
- 4. Security** - Only you have access to your data, via login and password. In addition, most providers encrypt your data which is more secure than storing an unencrypted copy on your machine.
- 5. Sharing** - The cloud offers a unique and effective way to share data. Those with login and permissions to a shared account can view agency data in real time.
- 6. Organization** - Everything you need is stored in one system, in one space rather than having data stored in multiple files across multiple machines.
- 7. Encourages Collaboration** - Central access to shared documents or spreadsheets makes collaborative tasks easy.

8. Application Access - Rather than having to install a software program on multiple computers or devices across an agency, programs are accessible from an internet browser. No software installation is ever needed.

9. Cost Savings - Cloud-based software providers automatically push out updates and fixes that may be necessary. No IT staff is typically necessary to successfully run cloud based systems.

10. Increased Performance - Since all your files are stored online, memory is freed up on the hard drives of all your devices. Cloud documents can also be accessed with greater speed online because the storage space of a cloud provider is generally vast.
