Consumer Alert - Tips to Avoid One Ring Scam Phone Calls

The Federal Communications Commission is alerting consumers to reported waves of "One Ring" or "Wangiri" scam robocalls targeting specific area codes in bursts often calling multiple times in the middle of the night.

The scammer may call repeatedly, hoping the consumer calls back and runs up a toll that is largely paid to the scammer.

Consumer Tips:

- Do not call back numbers you do not recognize especially those appearing to originate overseas.



- File a complaint with the FCC if you received these calls: www.fcc.gov/complaints
- If you never make international calls, considering talking to your phone company about blocking outbound international calls to prevent accidental toll calls.
- Check your phone bill for charges you don't recognize.

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
