

1999 With the rise of the internet and mobile technology, the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) were first published in 1999 as a follow-up to the ADA and were updated most recently in June 2018. WCAG 2.1 comprises the universally accepted best practices and guidelines for accessibility on websites and all

The federal government adopted WCAG 2.0 Levels A and AA in 2017 as the accessibility standard for all government websites, and WCAG has been the standard used by the Department of Justice (DOJ) for all web accessibility litigation so far.




