**Kansas Statutes, Rules and Regulations Common to Property and Casualty Insurance Only**

**Delivery of Contracts**

Any notice to parties to a contract that is to serve as evidence of insurance coverage may be delivered, stored, and presented by electronic means as long as it meets the requirements established by the Kansas Insurance Code.

Delivery of a notice will be considered equivalent to any delivery method required under applicable law, including delivery by first class mail, postage prepaid, certified mail, certificate of mail, or certificate of mailing.

A notice may be delivered electronically by an insurer as long as the receiving party has affirmatively consented to that method of delivery and has not withdrawn the consent, and has been informed of the requirements for accessing the notice delivered by electronic means.
