Amy launched The Riveter in 2017 while pregnant with her third daughter in three years. The startup's growth has outpaced even WeWork's first years and recently closed a \$15 million Series A funding round led by Alpha Edison. With five locations in Seattle, WA, and Los Angeles, CA (with more to come in 2019 and beyond) The Riveter is built on the vision of a world in which equality of opportunity in work is not a promise, but is a reality.
