



Announcement Regarding ISO - ILAC - IAF Mutual Recognition Agreement

Due to the redundant nature of maintaining dual accreditation to both ISO / IEC 17025 and ISO 9001:2000, Conrad Kacsik Instrument Systems, Inc. has determined that it will maintain ISO / IEC 17025 as its primary accreditation standard.

ISO (International Standards Organization), ILAC (International Laboratory Accreditation Council), and IAF (International Accreditation Forum) have published a Mutual Recognition Arrangement. A copy is attached for review.

The arrangement states that in addition to assessing the factors relevant to an organization's ability to produce precise, accurate, test and calibration data, the quality systems elements addressed in ISO 9001 certification are also covered by ISO / IEC 17025. To ensure continued compliance, accredited laboratories are regularly re-examined to ensure that they are maintaining their standards of technical expertise.

Conrad Kacsik Instrument Systems has been accredited by the American Association of Laboratory Accreditation (A2LA), since the year 2000, and will continue this practice in the future.

The **management system requirements** in ISO/IEC 17025 are written in language relevant to laboratory operations and operate generally in accordance with the principles of ISO 9001.*
