capital City where the government of a country or state is located.


citizen Person who is a member of his or her country.

city Place where many people live and work. A city is bigger than a town.


coastline The edge of a continent or island along a sea or an ocean.

community An area where people live. Places in a neighborhood are within walking distance of each other.


compass rose A set of arrows on a map that point north, south, east, and west.




continent One of the seven largest land areas.



country A land with one government. Some countries have many states.



Equator Imaginary line around the middle of the earth. The Equator is the same distance from the North Pole and the South Pole.



form Place where crops are grown, animals are raised for food, or both.

forest Area covered by trees.

globe A model of the earth that is round like a ball.

goods Products that can be bought and sold.

lake A body of water, usually fresh. The water in a lake stays in one place.

map A special drawing of all or part of the earth as seen from above. A map uses symbols and colors to show where places are located.

model Three-dimensional copy of an object or a place. A model is made at a size that is easy to study or play with.

mountain Part of the earth that is much taller than the land around it. A mountain is like a hill, but much larger and higher.

natural resource Something found in nature that is used by people.



needs Things that make it possible to live.


North Pole Imaginary point that is farther north than any other place on earth.



ocean One of the five large, salty bodies of water that cover most of the earth.



Prime Meridian Imaginary line from the North Pole to the South Pole. The Prime Meridian passes through London in the United Kingdom.



river A long, narrow body of water. The water in a river flows downhill.

sea Part of the ocean that has its own name. A sea is usually located near land.

services Jobs that help people.

settler Person who moves into an area to live.

South Pole Imaginary point that is farther south than any other place on earth.

state Part of a country. A state has a governor and laws of its own. There are 50 states in the United States of America.
