Equity Working Group

- Attend all EWG Design meetings, approximately 20 hours of meeting time between March, 2019 and May, 2019. The EWG will agree on a meeting schedule when it launches. Meetings times will include a mix of school day and after school meetings. We will do our best to minimize time that students and teachers are away from their classes. Team members will be compensated if time outside of the regular work day is required.
 - a. We will be meeting every two weeks starting in early March:
 - b. 5 Total Sessions
 - i. Session 1 Half Day (3-4 hours)
 - ii. Session 2 Full Day
 - iii. Session 3, 4, and 5 Half Day
- 2. Design a set of processes that will develop the skills and relationships for schools (students, staff & families) and home office to recognize, resolve and heal from critical incidents (between students and students, students and staff, and staff and staff)
 - a. Approval by the Leadership Team by the end of May, 2019.
 - b. Prioritize the work of the design process around school culture (students, staff, & family)
 - c. Work with home office representatives on the EWG to parallel the (school culture focused) work of the design process to apply to home office culture.
- 3. Incorporate input from Students, Parents, Teachers, Staff, Alumni, Board members and other DSST community members into the design process.
