**HISTORY OF INSTITUTIONAL TRANSITION**

- 1933-37 Southern Colorado Junior College
- 1937-61 Pueblo Junior College
- 1961-75 Southern Colorado State College evolved (established) March 1961; however, the name change did not appear on records until Fall, 1963 and the first 4 year graduation was held in 1965. **FIRST CATALOG UNDER SCSO WAS PRINTED FOR 1963-64.**
- 1975-June 30, 2003 The Colorado State legislature changed the name to University of Southern Colorado July 1975.
- July 1, 2003-Present Name changed to Colorado State University-Pueblo

**STUDENT ID NUMBER**

- 1962-66 Computerized grades, student listings, etc., started in September 1962. Student numbers began to be used at that time and at one point, a student number and an alpha number were used. Then only a student number was used and assigned by DP and as a result subject to change.
- 1966 - June 30, 2003 Social Security numbers began to be used Fall Quarter, 1966. Ended use of social security number June 30, 2003.
- July 1, 2003 - Present Unique personal identification number started being assigned.

**TERMS**

- Prior to Fall 1977 Prior to Fall 1977, the University under the quarter system had three terms and a two-five week summer session.
- Fall 1977-Present Under the semester system the University has two semesters and one summer session.

**GRADING SYSTEM**

- Prior to 1962 Prior to 1962 a 3-point system was used.

**GRADE-POINT AVERAGE COMPUTATION**

A grade-point average (GPA) is calculated by totaling the number of grade points earned, based on the scale above, and the number of credit hours undertaken. The total points earned divided by the total credit hours undertaken provides the grade point average.

**REPEATED COURSES**

Students may repeat courses. The first two times an undergraduate course is repeated only the higher grade and credit earned are computed into the student's grade-point average, provided the student has requested a re-computation of grade-point average by the Office of Records. The previously attempted courses and grades remain in the academic record but are not computed in the overall average. If a student elects to repeat a course more than two times, all grades earned thereafter will be computed in the grade-point average. Courses may not be repeated for re-computation of the student's grade point average after the degree has been awarded.

Transcripts contain an appropriate entry (RP) indicating that the grade point average has been recomputed.

**ENROLLMENT CLASSIFICATION**

Unclassified - This is the designation given a student who has not applied for or completed credential requirements as a degree seeking student.

**ACADEMIC STATUS**

Student is in good standing unless otherwise indicated. Only academic probation and suspension appear on the record.

**GRADUATION**

Under the quarter system a minimum of 183 hours were required for a Bachelor's degree.

Under the semester system a minimum of 122 hours were required through Spring, 1979. Effective Fall, 1979, a minimum of 128 hours were required. Effective Fall, 2001, a minimum of 120 hours is required.

Rank in graduating class is not available.

**ACCREDITATION**

Colorado State University-Pueblo is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, a Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
