After reflecting on this week's readings, what struck me the most was the responsorial Psalm: "In you Lord, I have found my peace." I think this stuck out to me so much because it relates to where I am currently at in my spirituality. I recently started the process of becoming Catholic through the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) program here at Neumann, and at our gathering the first week we discussed "God moments" we may have experienced. I thought this was going to be a really difficult thing for me to think of, but as I sat there in silence, moments just started racing through my mind. One of those God moments for me was when I made the decision to join the RCIA program. As I look back and reflect upon that decision, I realize I came to it all because in that single moment, I chose to put all my faith in and hand all

my worries over to God, and I trusted that He knew what He was doing, and that I was going to end up where I needed to be. To me, that moment of reassurance that God was there for me, that He was planning what He wanted me to do, is in fact a moment where I did feel at peace. Religion/faith is always something I lacked growing up and when I came to college, I found myself feeling almost empty, longing for something or someone to come along and fill that void. When I made the decision to join this program, I no longer felt that void, that emptiness, because my heart and mind were filled with not only joy, but relief, that I was becoming a part of a faith that valued a connection with God as much as I did.
