"Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" - Jesus

It is often very difficult to believe in the glory of God when one is experiencing the loss of a loved one in death. It is more often that we can connect with the sentiment of Mary who through her tears at the loss of her brother says to Jesus: "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died." The Gospel says: "Jesus wept." Anyone who has lost a loved one in death easily relates to this scene.

Personally, I have experienced the loss of a dear friend, a Sister of St. Francis, who died prematurely from cancer, my parents and an older brother who also died too young. These losses in life have helped me look at my own life from a different perspective, especially since all died younger than I am now.

Today's Gospel on the raising of Lazarus from the dead is a very dramatic story. Jesus calls Lazarus forth from the grave, still tightly wrapped in burial cloths and says: "Untie him, and let him go free."

As I knelt beside the bedside of my dying brother several years ago, I pleaded through my tears that Jesus would "untie" his body from the ravages of cancer and restore him to health. Suddenly, however, soon after the priest administered the last rites, my brother's face was transformed into a peaceful gaze as he uttered his last words, "Thanks be to God." It was then I realized that in some mysterious way Jesus had "untied" him and freed his soul for everlasting peace.

In the words of an Irish poet:

I pray that you will have the blessing of being consoled and sure about your death and may your spirit feel the surge of true delight when the veil of the invisible is raised and you glimpse again the living faces of departed family and friends.
