After education at Regis High School in Manhattan, New York, and Amherst College, he entered the Society of Jesus in Boston in 1983. His years of formation included philosophy studies at Fordham University, regency at Bishop Connolly High School, and theology at Weston Jesuit School of Theology in Cambridge . He was ordained a priest in 1993. He completed a doctorate in Christian social ethics at Emory University in 1997 and began teaching at Weston. As Professor of Moral Theology, he teaches courses in social ethics, Christian political thought and the role of religion in public life.

He has authored or edited five books, has published many articles, and lectures frequently on topics including Catholic social teaching and the moral evaluation of public policies regarding domestic and international issues, including foreign policy, anti-poverty efforts and globalization.
