Throughout the year, we are offering opportunities to reflect on *Service in the context of the Characteristics of Franciscan Higher Education*. The Association of Franciscan Colleges and Universities developed the statement on the *Characteristics of Franciscan Higher Education* to assist the 24 institutions to develop a common understanding of the basics of our Catholic Franciscan tradition.

During the Fall 2016 semester, 44 faculty members, 86 staff members, and 44 administrators participated in one of the 18 sessions offered. The Spring 2017 semester will provide 12 additional sessions. To date, 43 faculty members, 24 staff members, and two administrators have registered for these sessions.
