Bessie Coleman (January 26, 1892-April 30, 1926) was an American aviator and the first black woman and Native American to earn a pilot's license. Dr. Century will present the story of Ms. Coleman, a pioneer and inspiration to early pilots and to the African-American and Native



American communities. Daisy Century is an actress, speaker, author, radio talk show host and educator. She has traveled throughout the United States portraying figures of history.
