**PEWAUKEE RECYCLING EVENT MOVED TO  
WAUKESHA COUNTY TECHNICAL COLLEGE**  
*Goodwill collecting electronics and appliances*

**November 6, 2019...**Unprecedented community interest in this electronics and appliance recycling event warranted a move to a bigger space at Waukesha County Technical College, located at 800 Main Street, Pewaukee. This special one-day event is from 9 to noon in parking lots 19 and 20 near the “W” building on campus.

State law bans electronics and appliances from landfills and incinerators due to the valuable materials that can be recycled and reused. Many devices also contain hazardous materials and need to be disposed of properly.

“This collection assists our residents to comply with State law while providing options for responsible recycling,” said Analiese Smith, Recycling & Solid Waste supervisor for Waukesha County.

The collection event is for household electronics and appliances only:

Fee Required

TVs under 32” (flat screen and CRTs/tube-\$30/ea.)  
Tube TVs larger than 32” (\$70/ea.)  
Projection Style TVS (\$70/ea.)  
Cathode Ray Tube computer monitors (\$10/ea.)  
Paper for secure shredding (\$5 each Banker Box)

No Fee Required

Computers  
Laptops  
Flat Screen Computer Monitors  
Scanners, DVD players, VCRs,  
Stereos, cell phones, telephones,  
home goods, pre-shredded paper.

Items not Accepted

No broken or de-manufactured television or computer units

No Fee Required (Continued)

Appliances: air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators, microwaves, watercoolers, freezers, water heaters, washer/dryers, stoves, ovens/ranges, dishwashers.
