An estimated **91.2%** of MIPS Eligible Clinicians that participate in MIPS in 2019 are expected to receive positive or neutral payment adjustments.¹

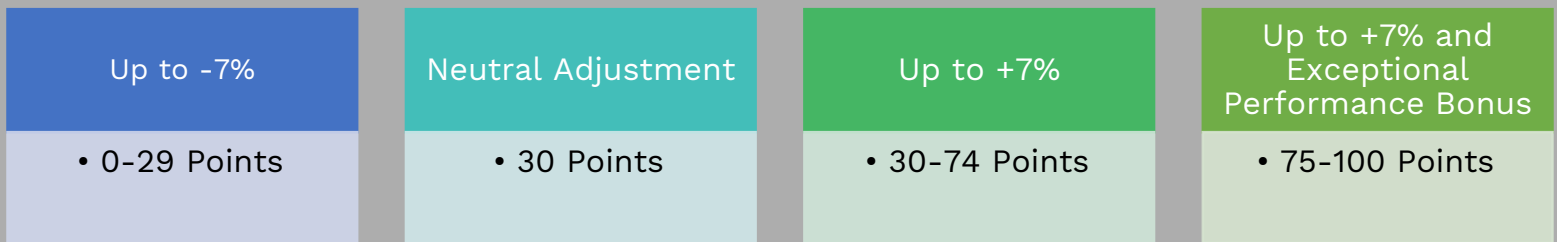
Who's Required to Play?

Eligible Clinician types expand to include:

- Physical Therapists
- Occupational Therapists
- Clinical Psychologists
- Qualified Speech-Language Pathologists
- Qualified Audiologists
- Registered Dieticians or Nutrition Professionals

What's at Stake?

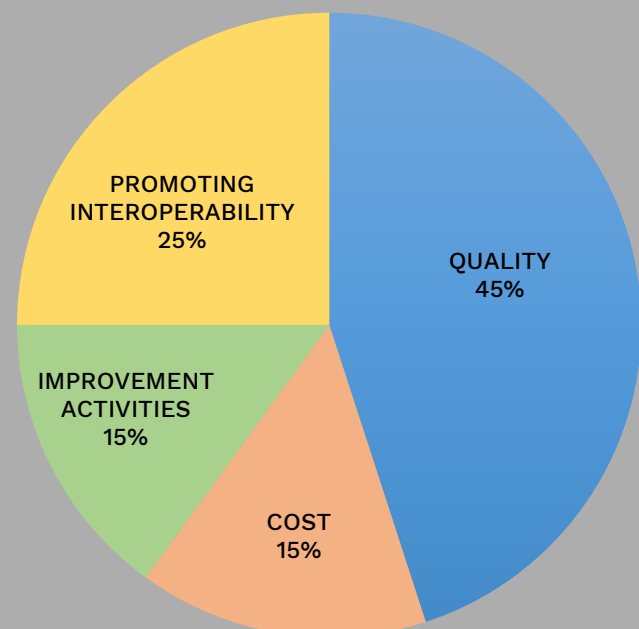
- The Performance Threshold for 2019 increases from 15 to 30 points.
- CMS anticipates a median MIPS score of 78.72 for 2019 reporting with adjustments as follows for 2021 payments:



What's New for Reporting?

- Low-volume MIPS 'Opt-In' option for Eligible Clinicians or Groups that are not required to report, but want to participate and be eligible for an adjustment.
- Facility-based scoring – and no quality data submission requirements – for facility-based clinicians and groups.
- Small practice bonus increases to 6 points and can now be added to the Quality Category.
- Improvement scoring for the Quality Category of up to 10 percentage points, for clinicians or groups that improve from lower performance in prior MIPS reporting years.
