- Three undergraduate degrees are offered in Entertainment Management, Music Performance and Audio Production
- The RTO has 15 VET qualifications on scope. The majority are from the CUS09 Music Training Package. These qualifications and individual units are delivered in schools through auspicing arrangements. Delivery occurs in Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia and South Australia with both government and non government schools.
- Programs in schools are delivered by existing music teachers who have a TAE40110 qualification. The RTO has a program in place to monitor quality of delivery.
- The RTO also has the TAE40110 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment on scope.
