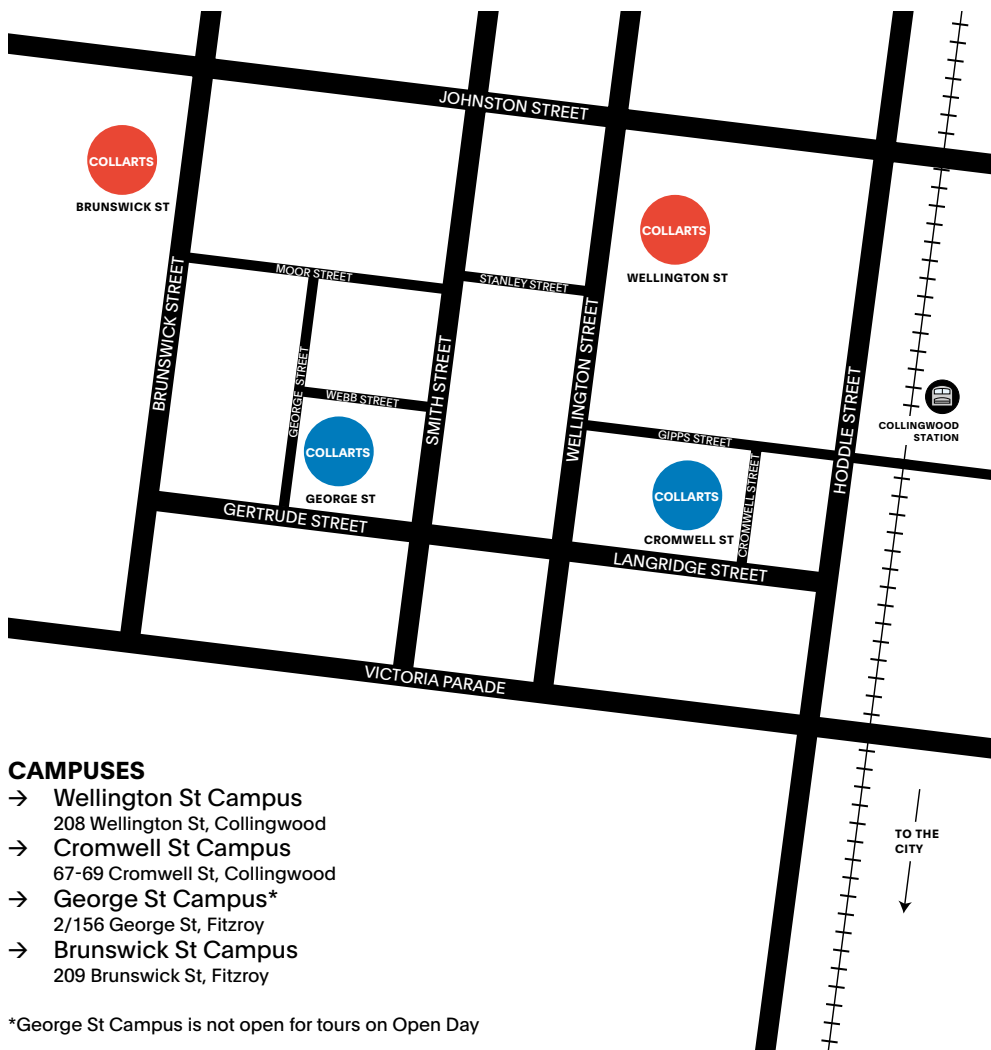

We also offer double degrees in:

- Audio Engineering + Entertainment Management
- Music Performance + Entertainment Management

Collarts works on a trimester schedule, which means we divide the year into three study periods instead of two semesters like most universities. This means that a full-time student can complete a bachelor degree in two years rather than the standard three.

- Double Degree: 9 trimesters (3 years full-time or part-time equivalent)
- Bachelor Degree: 6 trimesters (2 years full-time or part-time equivalent)
- Diploma: 2-3 trimesters (7-12 months full-time or part-time equivalent)

Collarts students can expect 12-16 contact hours per week, depending on the area of study. It is recommended that for every hour a student is in class, they spend two hours on personal study for that subject.

YEAR 12 STUDENTS

If you are in Year 12, you must apply through VTAC. Our Future Student team will contact you to organise an audition or interview once you have placed a Collarts course in your preferences.

NON-YEAR 12 STUDENTS / INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Non-Year 12 applicants must either have completed Year 12 successfully, or have two years of work experience (this experience does not have to be industry related) and be over the age of 20. To apply, you must complete an online application form and a member of our team will contact you to organise an interview or audition as well as a campus tour.

INFORMATION DESK

The Collarts staff at our Information Desk can answer all your application, enrolment and study questions.

CAMPUS TOURS

Campus tours run every 15 minutes throughout the day at our Wellington St campus. The Cromwell St and Brunswick St campuses are open for tours 9am-2pm.

COURSE INFORMATION SESSIONS

Each course information session runs for approximately 30 minutes and covers everything you need to know about your course, including unit structure, content, teachers, facilities, scholarship opportunities and more. Course Heads are available throughout the day for one-on-one bookings — please inquire at the Information Desk.

GENERAL INFORMATION SESSIONS

In the Admissions, VTAC & Enrolment session you will learn about the application, admissions processes and enrolment procedures, including a VTAC application overview for Year 12s.

OPPORTUNITIES AND EXPERIENCES

Collarts focuses on giving students real-life industry experiences so they are career-ready when they graduate. We provide a wide range of hands-on opportunities that enrich their study experience and connect them with the industry they want to work in.

Collarts supports students in a variety of ways, from overseas exchange programs at Drexel University in Philadelphia, USA, to international summer camps at Popakademie in Germany and more. Students also undertake internships and can gain experience working at major events such as Falls Festival, Melbourne Fashion Week, A Hitch To The Sticks, Groovin' The Moo and UNIFY Gathering.

GOVERNMENT FEE-HELP

(Higher Education Loan Program)

For eligible Australian citizens, course fees at Collarts are supported by the Australian government's FEE-HELP scheme. For students, this means no upfront tuition fees and, as with HECS, repayments for tuition fees are made gradually through the tax system — but only after surpassing a certain salary threshold.
