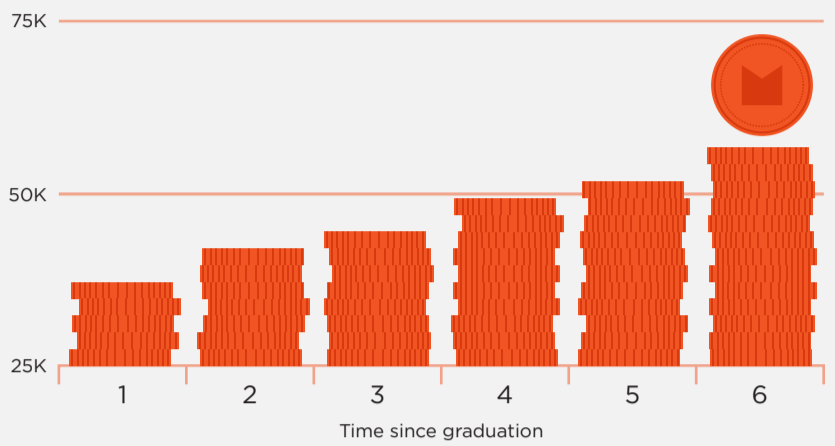


Makers accelerate faster

A year after finishing the course, a quarter of Makers are in mid-level positions at their companies. After two years, 65% are mid-level developers.

Valued more

The average salary of a junior developer out of Makers is £33,000. After 2 years' experience, the average Maker earns £45k. The average Maker senior dev is earning £70k.

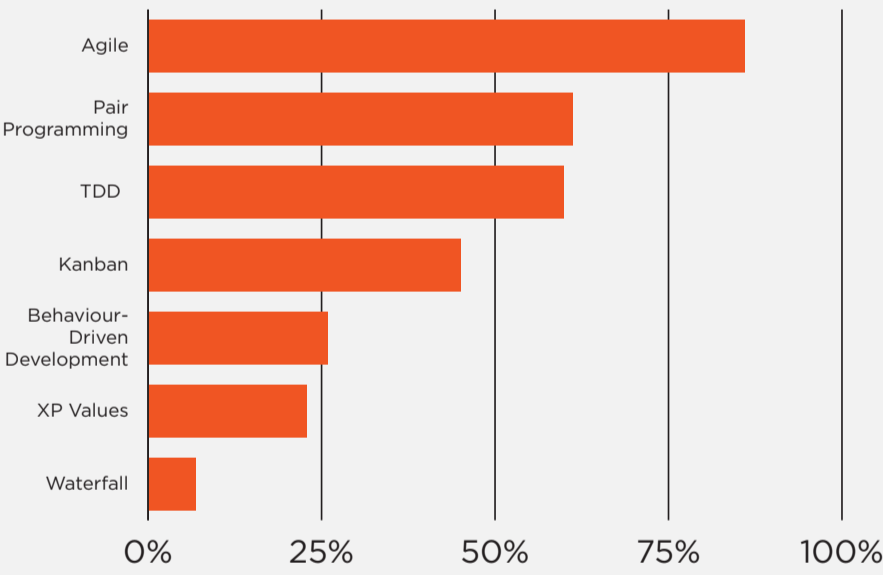
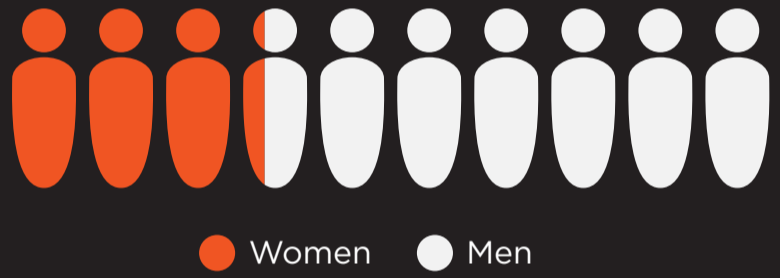


Adaptable skillset

While the Makers education focuses on Ruby and Javascript, our developers work in many different languages. Out of our alumni surveyed, 76% of them use JavaScript and 55% use React.js.

Diverse background

On average, 33% of Makers are women. The average age is 28 and they have a wealth of previous commercial experience across a wide range of industries, from neuroscience to 3D animation.

From day one, Makers are trained to follow industry best practices to set them up for work in a modern software team. 60% of alumni continue to use pair programming and TDD in the workplace.
