# Coronavirus Higher Education Industry Briefing: March 31

Provided by Campus Sonar—a higher education social listening agency

## Overview

#### **Social Listening Is**

The process of finding and analyzing publicly available online conversation. Common sources include social media, forums, blogs, and news sites.

#### **Coronavirus + Higher Education**

This analysis draws from 382,000 online conversations in the United States and on Reddit and YouTube (which span beyond the U.S.) about the coronavirus and the higher education industry. We're not searching for conversations about specific campuses.

#### **Analysis Period**

We analyzed four days of conversation: March 27–30 (based on EDT).



This analysis does not include Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram, or private social profiles.

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# Online Conversation Summary





### How We Categorize Conversation

### **All Mentions**

Captures every online mention that includes terms related to coronavirus AND the higher education industry. Higher ed may be just a small part of the mention (e.g., a news story discussing the impact of the coronavirus in a metro area with a mention of campuses that closed).

### **Higher Ed-Focused Mentions**

A subset of All Mentions. It captures when a campus or the industry is the focus of a mention about coronavirus (e.g., a headline of a news article or in a social media post).



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Volume Decreases; Higher Ed Focus Increases

There were ~382,000 mentions during the four-day period of March 27–30.

Conversation decreased 17% compared to the March 20–23 Briefing, one week earlier.

39% of all mentions were higher ed-focused. This is the highest higher ed-focused percentage of any Briefing period.

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\*Due to data access restrictions in this analysis, Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, and TikTok aren't included. Your campus social media manager is the best source of information regarding conversation on those networks.

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Social Media Rules; Students Use Reddit

Most conversation is still on social media (67% of all mentions and 78% of higher ed-focused mentions).

Student patterns are different. When speaking in the first-person about their experience, 41% of posts were on forums (mostly Reddit), 36% on social media, and 23% on Blogs/Tumblr.

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# Focus on Student Conversation



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### What Students Are Saying

### **Hidden Voices**

- A small portion of the online conversation about coronavirus and higher education is first-person accounts from individuals who reveal an affiliation with the campus community in their message (students, family/friends, prospects, admits, alumni).
- Without proper segmentation, these lived experiences can be missed amongst news headlines and commentary.
- We analyzed the mentions from students (2.8% of higher ed-focused conversation March 27–30) to identify themes that provide insight into the thoughts and feelings of campus community members. Use this analysis to inform your communication and service delivery.





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### Students Remain Angry and Sad

#### Sadness mentions included:

- Missing friends
- Lack of family support
- Cancelled/postponed graduations
- Loneliness
- Mental health and counseling needs

## **Students Make Direct Pleas for Funding**

### Quotes [*sic*] from students requesting funding from online celebrities.

- I could use the help I live with my disabled mother and we are barely paying bills so we have no money for groceries in our house my college closed recently and Ive been applying place nonstop but ppl arent hiring where I live
- my account is overdrawn and i have bills coming in left and right. i'm struggling since they closed my college and i need all the help i can get.
- Still have to pay rent at my college apartment that I'm not able to live at bc of corona
- i am so poor i go to college full time & my job is closed & i pay all my bills myself plz literally like \$5 would be cool
- I'm a broke college student, my school is online now and Idk when it'll stop, my job closed down and idk what my next paycheck is gonna be
- I'm currently left with no income. Can only work on campus due to my visa and my school is closed. Still have to pay for my apartment these months. It's going to be rough. Anything helps
- single mom, laid off work & my college courses went online. what a stressful time

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### Summary

- Conversation continued to decrease slightly, but the portion of higher ed-focused mentions was higher than we've previously seen.
- Social media remained the largest conversation source, although students were more likely to share personal experiences on Reddit and Tumblr than the general population.
- Online classes remained a common topic of conversation, along with Liberty University and how students are financially affected.
- Students are angry and sad. Their conversation demonstrates a need for co-curricular student services related to mental health and providing for basic needs.
