Notice of 2014 Annual General Meeting

Introduction and Background

I am pleased to invite you to this year's Annual General Meeting ("AGM"). This is the Company's first annual general meeting since we completed our major transaction in January by acquiring the entire issued share capital of Denara Holdings Limited by way of a reverse takeover of the Company. The AGM gives the Directors the opportunity to present the Company's performance and strategy to Shareholders and to listen and respond to your questions. The AGM will only deal with Ordinary Business which are the matters usually covered at annual general meetings. There will be no Special Business at this AGM. The Company's audited financial statements for the fifteen month period ended 31 December 2013 accompany this notice.

Ordinary Business

The following notes explain some of the items of ordinary business to be conducted at the AGM.

Resolution 2: Re-election of Angus McCaffery

According to Article 24.3 of the Articles of Association any Director must retire at the first AGM after their appointment but shall also be eligible for re-election at the AGM. Angus was appointed as a director on 6 March 2013.

Resolution 3: Re-election of Nick Bate

According to Article 24.3 of the Articles of Association any Director must retire at the first AGM after their appointment but shall also be eligible for re-election at the AGM. Nick was appointed as a director on 10 January 2014.

Resolution 4: Re-election of Mike Read

According to Article 24.3 of the Articles of Association any Director must retire at the first AGM after their appointment but shall also be eligible for re-election at the AGM. Mike was appointed as a director on 10 January 2014.

Resolution 5: Re-election of David Redwood

According to Article 24.3 of the Articles of Association any Director must retire at the first AGM after their appointment but shall also be eligible for re-election at the AGM. David was appointed as a director on 10 January 2014.

Resolution 6: Re-election of Nigel Redwood

According to Article 24.3 of the Articles of Association any Director must retire at the first AGM after their appointment but shall also be eligible for re-election at the AGM. Nigel was appointed as a director on 10 January 2014.

Resolution 7: Re-election of Niki Redwood

According to Article 24.3 of the Articles of Association any Director must retire at the first AGM after their appointment but shall also be eligible for re-election at the AGM. Niki was appointed as a director on 10 January 2014.

Resolution 9: Authority to allot equity securities

The purpose of Resolution 9 is to renew the Directors' power to allot shares and rights to subscribe for them.

The authority in Resolution 9 will allow the Directors to allot new shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert other securities into shares. The authority is a general authority to allot new shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert other securities into shares up to a nominal value of £1,180,000, which is equivalent to approximately 33.36 per cent of the total issued Ordinary Share capital of the Company, as at the date of publication of this document.

The Directors recognise that the Company may need to issue new Ordinary Shares as either share consideration and/or to fund cash consideration which may be greater than the current cash reserves of the Company for any further acquisition and so are asking for a similar proportionate size authority to that obtained in January of this year at the general meeting which approved the reverse takeover of the Company to acquire the holding company of e-know.net Limited. The Directors do not have a present intention of exercising the authority to be given by Resolution 9 because no acquisition or transaction has been finalised, although the Directors continue to actively review the range of acquisition opportunities and discussions are ongoing. The Directors will therefore consider issuing shares if they believe it would be appropriate to do so in respect of business opportunities that arise consistent with the Company's strategic objectives.

If the resolution is passed, the authority will expire on the earlier of the end of the AGM in 2015 or on 28 July 2015.

Resolution 10: Disapplication of pre-emption rights

If the Directors wish to allot new shares and other equity securities, or sell treasury shares, for cash (other than in connection with an employee share scheme), company law requires that these shares are offered first to shareholders in proportion to their existing holdings.

The purpose of Resolution 10 is to authorise Directors to allot new shares pursuant to the authority given by Resolution 9, or sell treasury shares, for cash in connection with a pre-emptive offer or otherwise up to a nominal value of £176,830 equivalent to approximately 5 per cent of the total issued Ordinary Share capital of the Company as at the date of this document without the shares first being offered to existing shareholders in proportion to their existing holdings.

The Board considers the authority in Resolution 10 to be appropriate in order to allow the Company the flexibility to finance any further acquisitions or other opportunities without the need to comply with the strict requirements of the statutory pre-emption provisions.

Action to be taken in respect of the Annual General Meeting by the holders of Ordinary Shares

Set out at the end of this document is the notice convening the Annual General Meeting of the Shareholders to be held at the offices of the Company at Datapoint House, 400 Queensway Business Park, Queensway, Telford, Shropshire, TF1 7UL on 28th May 2014 at 11.00a.m., at which the resolutions set out in the notice of AGM (the "Resolutions") will be proposed.

A Form of Proxy for use at the Annual General Meeting of the Shareholders is enclosed with this document.

Whether or not you intend to attend and participate at the Annual General Meeting, the Form of Proxy should be completed and signed in accordance with the instructions on it and in accordance with the Company's articles of association and returned to the Company's registrars, Neville Registrars Limited, Neville House, 18 Laurel Lane, Halesowen, West Midlands, B63 3DA as soon as possible, but in any event so as to be received not later than 11.00 a.m. on 26th May 2014.

The completion and return of the Form of Proxy will not preclude you from attending the Annual General Meeting and voting in person should you so wish.

Recommendation

The Directors consider that the Resolutions are in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole and accordingly unanimously recommend that you vote in favour of the Resolutions as set out in the Notice of the Annual General Meeting, as your Directors intend to do or procure to be done in respect of their legal and beneficial holdings of Ordinary Shares, which amount, in aggregate, to 34,817,341 Ordinary Shares, representing approximately 9.84 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company.

Ordinary resolutions

1. To receive and adopt the report and accounts of the Company for the period ended 31 December 2013.
2. To re-elect Angus McCaffery as a director whose office terminates at the AGM and who becomes eligible for election pursuant to article 24.3 of the Articles.
3. To re-elect Nick Bate as a director whose office terminates at the AGM and who becomes eligible for election pursuant to article 24.3 of the Articles.
4. To re-elect Mike Read as a director whose office terminates at the AGM and who becomes eligible for election pursuant to article 24.3 of the Articles.
5. To re-elect David Redwood as a director whose office terminates at the AGM and who becomes eligible for election pursuant to article 24.3 of the Articles.
6. To re-elect Nigel Redwood as a director whose office terminates at the AGM and who becomes eligible for election pursuant to article 24.3 of the Articles.
7. To re-elect Niki Redwood as a director whose office terminates at the AGM and who becomes eligible for election pursuant to article 24.3 of the Articles.
8. To re-appoint KPMG LLP of One Snowhill, Snow Hill Queensway, Birmingham, B4 6GH as auditors to hold office until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company at which accounts are laid and to authorise the directors to fix the remuneration of the auditors.
9. That the Directors be generally and unconditionally authorised pursuant to and in accordance with section 551 of the Companies Act 2006 (the "**Act**") to exercise all the powers of the Company to allot shares or grant rights to subscribe for or to convert any security into shares up to a nominal value of £1,180,000 and such authority shall apply in substitution for all previous authorities and to expire on the date which is earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or 15 months after the passing of this resolution unless previously renewed, varied or revoked by the Company in general meeting but, in each case, so that the Company may make offers and enter into agreements during the relevant period which would, or might, require shares to be allotted or rights to subscribe for or to convert any security into shares to be granted after the authority ends.

Special resolution

10. That, subject to the passing of resolution 9 above, the Directors be and are hereby empowered to allot equity securities (as defined in Section 560(1) of the Act) wholly for cash pursuant to the authority given by resolution 9 above or where the allotment constitutes an allotment of equity securities by virtue of Section 560(2) of the Act up to a nominal value of £176,830 as if Section 561(1) of the Act did not apply to any such allotment, such authority to expire on the date which is earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or 15 months after the passing of this resolution unless previously renewed, varied or revoked by the Company in general meeting, but in each case, so that the Company may make offers and enter into agreements during the relevant period which would, or might, require equity securities to be allotted after the authority ends.

For the purposes of this resolution:

- (i) references to an allotment of equity securities shall include a sale of treasury shares; and
- (ii) the nominal amount of any securities shall be taken to be, in the case of rights to subscribe for or convert any securities into shares of the Company, the nominal amount of such shares which may be allotted pursuant to such rights.

1. Shareholders entitled to attend and vote at the meeting may appoint a proxy or proxies to attend and speak on their behalf. Investors who hold their shares through a nominee may wish to attend the meeting as a proxy, or to arrange for someone else to do so for them, in which case they should discuss this with their nominee or stockbroker. Shareholders are invited to complete and return the enclosed Proxy Form. Completion of the Proxy Form will not prevent a Shareholder from attending and voting at the meeting if subsequently he/she finds they are able to do so. Representatives of Shareholders which are corporations attending the meeting should produce evidence of their appointment by an instrument executed in accordance with section 44 of the Companies Act 2006 or signed on behalf of the corporation by a duly authorised officer or agent and in accordance with article 19.6 of the Company's articles of association.
3. Any corporation which is a member can appoint one or more corporate representatives who may exercise on its behalf all of its powers as a member provided that they do not do so in relation to the same shares.
4. The Company, pursuant to Regulation 41 of the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001, specifies that only those holders of Ordinary Shares registered in the register of members of the Company at 11.00 a.m. on 26 May 2014 (being 48 hours prior to the time fixed for the meeting excluding any part of a day that is not a working day) shall be entitled to attend and vote at the AGM in respect of such number of shares registered in their name at that time. Changes to entries in the register of members after 11.00 a.m. on 26 May 2014 shall be disregarded in determining the rights of any person to attend or vote at the meeting.
5. The Directors' service agreements will be available for inspection during usual business hours on any weekday (Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays excluded) at the registered office of the Company until the date of the Annual General Meeting and at the place of the meeting for 15 minutes prior and until the termination of the meeting.
