**WHAT:** Mazeroski Day 2015  
Join the Game 7 Gang and Pirates fans young and old alike as they listen to the original broadcast of the 1960 World Series, including the series-clinching game seven home run by lifelong Pirate Bill Mazeroski.

**WHO:** The Pittsburgh Parks Conservancy and Schenley Plaza host the annual celebration of Mazeroski Day. The gathering of hundreds of Pittsburgh Pirates fans has taken place since 1985, and in recent years has drawn considerable public and press attention. This organic, grass-roots event brings the city together to celebrate the amazing baseball tradition of our city. A section of the original Forbes Field wall over which Mazeroski's winning home run sailed is at Schenley Plaza, and is the gathering place for the event. The Porch Restaurant gets into the spirit of the game by offering baseball snacks and drinks from a cart, and fans bring lawn chairs and enthusiasm.
