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Changes In U.S. Payroll Module Pricing

New Subscription-Based Payroll Tiers

Sage recently announced that beginning in May 2016, Sage 100 customers running the **U.S. Payroll Module** will see a change in pricing. Based on newly-structured **payroll tiers**, customers will pay based on the number of paychecks processed for active employees. Read on to learn more about why Sage is making the change and how the new payroll pricing structure works.

Why is Sage Implementing Price Tiers?

Sage feels the new pricing structure is more fair and consistent because you now pay only based on the number of employees for whom you process payroll. For example, a customer with only 10 employees on payroll will no longer pay the same price as a customer with 250 employees.

What Do the Tiers Look Like?

There are 13 subscription-based payroll tiers starting with customers that have a maximum of 10 active employees, all the way up to companies that have over 500 employees.

The subscription-based pricing requires an annual commitment that can be paid either monthly or yearly by credit card or ACH debit (no checks). If you own the payroll module **before April 18, 2016**, your subscription is calculated based on **Existing Customer** pricing - which you'll notice is substantially less than pricing for **New Customers** that purchase U.S. Payroll after April 18th.

What Happens Next?

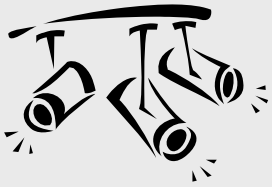
Beginning in May 2016, existing Sage 100 payroll customers will be asked to subscribe to the new payroll tiers prior to your next Sage Business Care Plan renewal. Payroll will be **invoiced separately** and unbundled from the Business Care plan for the rest of your ERP modules .

As part of the notification process and transition, you'll be asked to validate your payroll tier based on the number of paychecks processed. You can move up or down tiers any time prior to your next billing.

Using Interactive Dashboards

Whether you're a salesperson, support rep, manager, or VP, the interactive dashboards in Sage CRM can be a really important tool in helping you leverage CRM data most effectively. In this article, we'll take a look at how to use and customize these powerful dashboards.

What is an Interactive Dashboard?

An interactive dashboard is a highly-customizable workspace that allows you to control and personalize the CRM data that displays onscreen. In short, it provides a snapshot of the CRM information and tasks you use most often so you have quick access and can be effective in your job.

You can create multiple dashboards by either starting with an existing pre-defined template (like sales, management, or support dashboards) or create your own new and unique dashboard layout.

Customizing Gadgets

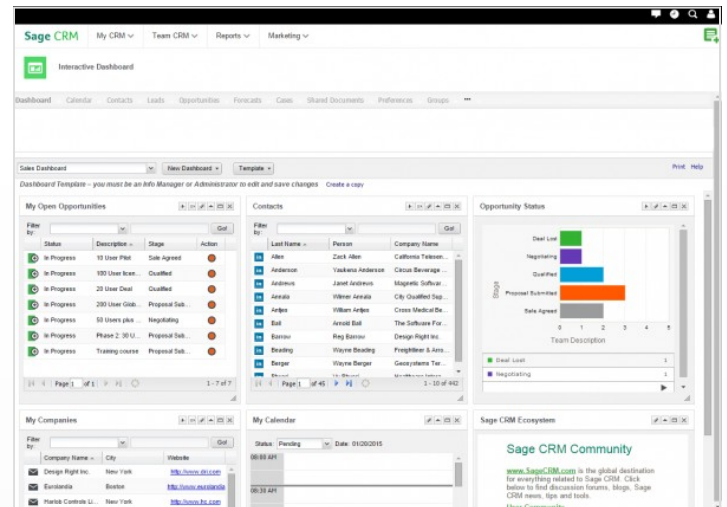
Each dashboard contains a collection of individual gadgets that can display feeds, workflows, and actions that you want to drive from your personalized workspace. You drag and drop these gadgets onto your dashboard to create the customized data display and layout you want.

Standard gadgets are available for things like your calendar and appointments, sales opportunities, support cases, important customer contacts, and more. Not only do these gadgets feed information from Sage CRM, they can also pull information from external websites and even back office accounting data from your Sage 100 system.

You can edit gadget properties and you can even perform tasks from some of them, such as logging a new case or advancing a sales opportunity to the next step.

Getting Started

To access the interactive dashboard, go to [My CRM](#) > [Dashboard](#) where a welcome dashboard is displayed.



Follow these steps to begin creating a new dashboard:

1. Click **New Dashboard** > **Choose Template**
2. Highlight one of the dashboards in the list and click **OK**
3. Give the new dashboard a **Name** and click **OK**
4. Click **New Gadget** > **Choose Template** to add predefined gadgets
5. Click **Edit** (pencil icon) on the **gadget header** to modify an existing gadget, or create your own custom gadget from **New Gadget** > **Create Gadget**

Now you can set this new dashboard as your default, or even copy the dashboard as a starting point for creating another.

This example assumes your system includes either the standard Sage CRM demo data, or at least one dashboard template and one gadget template set up by an Info Manager or System Administrator.
