Definitions.

- (1) **High-Performer PHA** – A PHA that owns or manages more than 550 combined public housing units and housing choice vouchers, and was designated as a high performer on both of the most recent Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) and Section Eight Management Assessment Program (SEMAP) assessments if administering both programs, or PHAS if only administering public housing.
- (2) **Small PHA** - A PHA that is not designated as PHAS or SEMAP troubled, or at risk of being designated as troubled, that owns or manages less than 250 public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550.
- (3) **Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Only PHA** - A PHA that administers more than 550 HCVs, was not designated as troubled in its most recent SEMAP assessment, and does not own or manage public housing.
- (4) **Standard PHA** - A PHA that owns or manages 250 or more public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550, and that was designated as a standard performer in the most recent PHAS and SEMAP assessments.
- (5) **Troubled PHA** - A PHA that achieves an overall PHAS or SEMAP score of less than 60 percent.
- (6) **Qualified PHA** - A PHA with 550 or fewer public housing dwelling units and/or housing choice vouchers combined, and is not PHAS or SEMAP troubled.

Additional Status Update

LHA has received HUD funding for 1,565 baseline units.

As of August 1, 2018, there are 1,511 households included in the program, of which 90% are categorized extremely low income. The average household gross annual income is \$10,151.00. All households are classified as disabled, 52% are female heads of household with children and 85% are Black/African American.

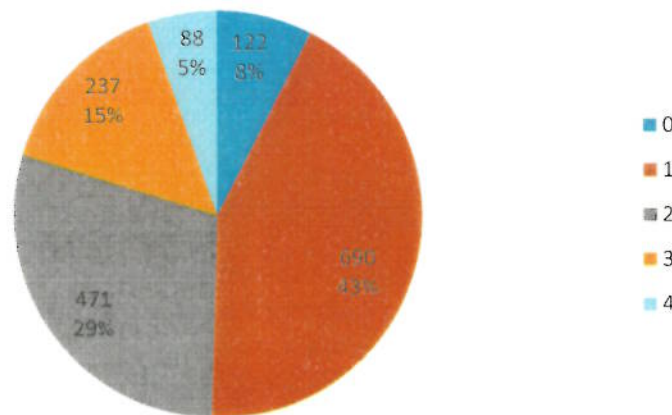

1,608 units are under Housing Assistance Payment contracts. These units are broken down as follows: 122 (8%) studio units, 690 (43%) one-bedroom units, 471 (29%) two-bedroom units, 237 (15%) three-bedroom units, 88 (5%) four-bedroom units. There are an additional 39 units under an Agreement to enter into a Housing Assistance Payment Contract.

New units for the program will be brought on, in part, through the award of vouchers to projects from the Louisiana Housing Corporation's Notice of Funding Availability

that included 4% Low Income Housing Tax Credits, HOME and disaster CDBG funds and from the award of vouchers to projects from the Qualified Allocation Plan that provided favorable treatment for proposals containing program units. Vouchers will be allocated based on waiting list demand. There are approximately 2,091 households on waiting lists.

11.0 (f) Resident Advisory Board (RAB) comments

The RABs are active in all six regions in the Gulf Opportunity Zone. RAB meetings were held during at various times during year 2018. An overview of the PSH program was presented at each meeting with a strong emphasis on the importance of submitting documents required annually to avoid termination of assistance. There were no comments received about the 2019 PHA draft plan.

11.0 (g) Challenged Elements

There were no challenged elements noted during the 45-day comment period or during the October 1, 2018 Public Hearing.

Admin Plan Updates

A new section added as Chapter 2 as follows:

Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing Section

2.1 Overview

The LHA has been awarded ten Housing and Urban Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) vouchers that the LHA will administer as tenant-based vouchers in partnership with the Alexandria VA Health Care System (VAHCS). The LHA and AVAHCS expect to assist ten homeless veterans and their families in the Lake Charles area with these vouchers, with VAHCS providing case management. LHA reserves the right to project-base these units as well.

The LHA will administer the HUD-VASH vouchers in a manner that adheres to all applicable requirements of the HUD-VASH program, including applicable tenant-based voucher requirements at 24 CFR Part 982 and applicable HUD-VASH program requirements.

Applicable HUD-VASH program requirements include waivers and alternative requirements authorized by the HUD-VASH program statute and detailed in the Revised Operating Requirements published in the Federal Register on March 23, 2012 (77 Fed. Reg. 17086-17090). This and other documents pertinent to the program are on the HUD-VASH website at:

https://www.hud.gov/program_offices/public_indian_housing/programs/hcv/vash. The provisions of this Administrative Plan are applicable to HUD-VASH vouchers except

where inconsistent with requirements of the HUD-VASH program, in which case the latter requirements are applicable.

2.2 Eligibility and Screening

Eligible veterans for VASH vouchers will be referred by the VAMC with written documentation of the referral maintained in the file.

Screening will include income eligibility and sex offender screening only. EIV, prior debt and adverse termination screening do not apply to VASH families. Other VASH family members should be screened and denied if they have a lifetime sex offender registration requirement;

2.3 Housing Search, Lease-up and Portability

The initial voucher term for a VASH voucher will be 120 days.

Initial leases may be less than one year if a shorter lease term would improve housing opportunities for the tenant.

VASH voucher holders may use their voucher to live on the grounds of a VAMC in units owned by the VAMC.

VASH participants may only reside in jurisdictional areas that are accessible to case management services as determined by the partnering VAMC. In all cases of portability, the initial VA facility must be consulted prior to the move and provide written confirmation that case management will continue to be provided in the family's new location.

If the receiving PHA does not administer a HUD-VASH program, it must always bill the initial PHA. If the receiving PHA does administer HUD-VASH vouchers, it may only absorb the family if a HUD- VASH voucher is available and case management can be provided through a VA facility that partners with the receiving PHA. In all cases of portability within the same catchment area, the initial VA facility must make the determination regarding which VA facility will provide the family with case management. This determination will ultimately affect whether the receiving PHA can absorb the family.

2.4 Tenancy Issues

If the veteran dies, the voucher remains with the remaining members of the tenant family, however the PHA may issue a regular tenant based voucher and free up the VASH voucher.

In the case of family splits, i.e. divorce, the VASH voucher remains with the veteran.

A VASH voucher family may be terminated for failure to participate in required case management; however, a VAMC determination that the participant family no longer requires case management is not grounds for termination of assistance. The PHA has the option to offer this family one of its regular vouchers in order to free up the VASH voucher.

VASH families are entitled to informal hearings and reviews.

Section 3.2 Owner Proposal Selection Procedures, at the end of the second paragraph add “New units may be added at any time during the term of the HAP contract without being subject to competitive selection procedures.”

After the third paragraph add,

“From time to time, the LHA also selects properties through a Request for Proposal Owner Solicitation described in detail below.”

“As appropriate, the LHA will also lease units in place for persons who are eligible for the PSH program.”

LHA Owned Units add “PIH Notice 2017-21” at the end of the paragraph.

Prohibition of Assistance for Certain Units, added

Definition of Property - For purposes of this Plan, an eligible project may be a single building, multiple contiguous buildings, or multiple buildings on contiguous parcels of land.

Housing Quality standards replaced with Uniform Physical Conditions Standards (UPCS)

Footnote added at the end of Request for proposal process

1 The LHA is transitioning from using Housing Quality Standards (HQS) to UPCS. The LHA reserves the right to use either standard as appropriate.

Section 3.3 Dwelling Units, added at the end of the section

Adding Dwelling Units

As per PIH Notice 2017-21, new units can be added to an existing HAP at any point in time.

Section 3.6 Housing Assistance Payments (“HAP”) Contract, section c, Term of HAP Contract,

Maximum term changed from 30 to 40

Length of term of HAP contract changed from 15 years with a 15-year extension for a total of 30 years to 20 years with a 20-year extension for a total of 40 years.

New section added as follows, section 3.8 Cost Savings and Terminations of HAP

Contracts

In the event appropriated funds are insufficient to fund all vouchers administered by the LHA, the PHA will implement cost-saving measures found in Notice PIH 2011–28 (“Cost-Saving Measures in the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program”) or subsequent notices. If the LHA implements all of these cost-saving measures and still has insufficient funds to cover its housing assistance payments, then the LHA may choose to terminate payments under the program.

Section 4.5.4 Database, added “All applicants to the program are” to beginning of the section and added “This is the LHA’s system of record that meets HUD requirements” to the end.

Section 4.12.3 Determining Eligibility, added section 5 as follows:

As per PIH Notice 2016-05, an applicant family may become a program participant for the first 90 days even if the family lacks the documentation necessary to verify the Social Security Number (SSN) of day period must be granted if the LHA determines the applicant’s failure to comply was due to circumstances that could not reasonably be foreseen and were outside of the control of the applicant

Section 5.5 Earned Income Disallowances, added section 5.6 as follows:

Exclusion of mandatory education fees

As per PIH Notice 2016-05, the definition of income excludes from calculations of individual income any financial assistance received for mandatory fees and charges (in addition to tuition). For guidance as to what constitutes such fees, the LHA will rely on Notice PIH 2015-21.

Violence Against Women Act Certification

The Louisiana Housing Authority, as administrator of a federal funded housing program - shall protect victims of criminal domestic violence, sexual assaults, or stalking, as well as members of the victims' family- from losing their HUD assisted housing as a result of the aforementioned crime committed against them.

The agency's Administrative Plan covers denial of admission to the program and termination of continued participation relative to the Violence Against Women Act and serves as protection of such abuse.

Acting on behalf of the Board of Commissioners of the Public Housing Agency (PHA) listed below, as its Chairman or other authorized PHA official if there is no Board of Commissioners, I approve the submission of the Annual PHA Plan for the PHA fiscal year beginning 2018, hereinafter referred to as "the Plan", of which this document is a part and make the following certifications and agreements with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in connection with the submission of the Plan and implementation thereof:

1. The Plan is consistent with the applicable comprehensive housing affordability strategy (or any plan incorporating such strategy) for the jurisdiction in which the PHA is located.
2. The Plan contains a certification by the appropriate State or local officials that the Plan is consistent with the applicable Consolidated Plan, which includes a certification that requires the preparation of an Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice, for the PHA's jurisdiction and a description of the manner in which the PHA Plan is consistent with the applicable Consolidated Plan.
3. The PHA has established a Resident Advisory Board or Boards, the membership of which represents the residents assisted by the PHA, consulted with this Resident Advisory Board or Boards in developing the Plan, including any changes or revisions to the policies and programs identified in the Plan before they were implemented, and considered the recommendations of the RAB (24 CFR 903.13). The PHA has included in the Plan submission a copy of the recommendations made by the Resident Advisory Board or Boards and a description of the manner in which the Plan addresses these recommendations.
4. The PHA made the proposed Plan and all information relevant to the public hearing available for public inspection at least 45 days before the hearing, published a notice that a hearing would be held and conducted a hearing to discuss the Plan and invited public comment.
5. The PHA certifies that it will carry out the Plan in conformity with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Fair Housing Act, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.
6. The PHA will affirmatively further fair housing by examining their programs or proposed programs, identifying any impediments to fair housing choice within those programs, addressing those impediments in a reasonable fashion in view of the resources available and work with local jurisdictions to implement any of the jurisdiction's initiatives to affirmatively further fair housing that require the PHA's involvement and by maintaining records reflecting these analyses and actions.
7. For PHA Plans that includes a policy for site based waiting lists:
 - The PHA regularly submits required data to HUD's 50058 PIC/IMS Module in an accurate, complete and timely manner (as specified in PIH Notice 2010-25);
 - The system of site-based waiting lists provides for full disclosure to each applicant in the selection of the development in which to reside, including basic information about available sites; and an estimate of the period of time the applicant would likely have to wait to be admitted to units of different sizes and types at each site;
 - Adoption of a site-based waiting list would not violate any court order or settlement agreement or be inconsistent with a pending complaint brought by HUD;
 - The PHA shall take reasonable measures to assure that such a waiting list is consistent with affirmatively furthering fair housing;
 - The PHA provides for review of its site-based waiting list policy to determine if it is consistent with civil rights laws and certifications, as specified in 24 CFR part 903.7(c)(1).
8. The PHA will comply with the prohibitions against discrimination on the basis of age pursuant to the Age Discrimination Act of 1975.
9. The PHA will comply with the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968 and 24 CFR Part 41, Policies and Procedures for the Enforcement of Standards and Requirements for Accessibility by the Physically Handicapped.
10. The PHA will comply with the requirements of section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, Employment Opportunities for Low-or Very-Low Income Persons, and with its implementing regulation at 24 CFR Part 135.
11. The PHA will comply with acquisition and relocation requirements of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 and implementing regulations at 49 CFR Part 24 as applicable.

12. The PHA will take appropriate affirmative action to award contracts to minority and women's business enterprises under 24 CFR 5.105(a).
13. The PHA will provide the responsible entity or HUD any documentation that the responsible entity or HUD needs to carry out its review under the National Environmental Policy Act and other related authorities in accordance with 24 CFR Part 58 or Part 50, respectively.
14. With respect to public housing the PHA will comply with Davis-Bacon or HUD determined wage rate requirements under Section 12 of the United States Housing Act of 1937 and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act.
15. The PHA will keep records in accordance with 24 CFR 85.20 and facilitate an effective audit to determine compliance with program requirements.
16. The PHA will comply with the Lead-Based Paint Poisoning Prevention Act, the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992, and 24 CFR Part 35.
17. The PHA will comply with the policies, guidelines, and requirements of OMB Circular No. A-87 (Cost Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Governments), 2 CFR Part 225, and 24 CFR Part 85 (Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State, Local and Federally Recognized Indian Tribal Governments).
18. The PHA will undertake only activities and programs covered by the Plan in a manner consistent with its Plan and will utilize covered grant funds only for activities that are approvable under the regulations and included in its Plan.
19. All attachments to the Plan have been and will continue to be available at all times and all locations that the PHA Plan is available for public inspection. All required supporting documents have been made available for public inspection along with the Plan and additional requirements at the primary business office of the PHA and at all other times and locations identified by the PHA in its PHA Plan and will continue to be made available at least at the primary business office of the PHA.
22. The PHA certifies that it is in compliance with applicable Federal statutory and regulatory requirements, including the Declaration of Trust(s).
