


AP French Summer Work 2020

- 2.) Reflect on/Take note of how the novel relates to one or more of the AP themes.

Listening Comprehension (Mandatory)

Developing your listening skills is essential to success in AP French. Therefore, you will complete 1 listening task over the course of the designated weeks. You will listen to the "[Journal en Français Facile](#)" for one of the days during the assigned week. Each day's podcast is 10 minutes. While you listen or once you have finished, you will complete the appropriate Google Form (to be emailed) for the week by the end of the assigned week.

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The following summer activities are optional, but strongly recommended:

Vocabulary Development: A strong, developed vocabulary is essential for success in AP French. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that you spend some time each day (10-15 minutes) or about an hour each week reviewing and developing your vocabulary. I have put together several [Quizlet vocabulary sets](#) for you to use to help in this area.

Grammar Development: Though grammar is not directly assessed on the AP exam, it is important to have a solid foundation in this area in order to effectively present ideas in speaking and writing. The following websites offer practice and explanation of various grammar points including verb tenses and conjugations, pronouns, interrogatives, etc.:
