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GPs are confronted with common skin, nail and hair conditions on a regular basis as patients have limited access to dermatologists. In fact, the largest organ of the human body makes up 15 per cent of general practice consultations on a day-to-day basis. Undergraduate dermatology training is minimal in many medical schools and without additional education in general dermatology, GPs are often under-equipped to handle common presentations such as paediatric infections, atopic eczema, chronic plaque psoriasis, female pattern hair loss, and many more conditions. DELIVERY FORMAT

Each course consists of eight online modules. All courses include a full-colour workbook and access to additional learning resources, reference materials and video lectures. You will also receive valuable 12 months web-based support from the presenters and participate in regular online learning sessions with the opportunity to ask any questions you might have as you implement your learning.

PATHWAY OPTIONS

This university quality-assured three-part program consists of the Professional Certificate, Advanced Certificate and Professional Diploma of General Dermatology. Upon completion of the online program, graduates are eligible to apply for Accreditation of Prior Certified Learning (APCL) for module 3 of the Postgraduate Diploma in Dermatology studied through the Rila Institute of Health Sciences and awarded by the University of Plymouth (UK). To increase the accuracy of their work, graduates are encouraged to complete a clinical attachment. Clinical attachments in dermatology are currently available at the Medical University of Lyon under the supervision of Professor Luc Thomas, and at the Medical University of Vienna under the supervision of Professor Harald Kittler. Course graduates may also join the International Society of Dermatology which has been in operation since 1959 and has members from all over the world.
