What is Alzheimer's? According to the Alzheimer's Association website, Alzheimer's is a type of dementia that causes challenges with memory, thinking and behavior. Symptoms usually develop slowly and increase over time, and begin to interfere with daily tasks. Alzheimer's is the most common form of dementia, a general term for memory loss and other intellectual abilities serious enough to interfere with daily life. Alzheimer's disease accounts for 60 to 80 percent of dementia cases. *What Causes Alzheimer's?* Experts agree that in most cases, Alzheimer's and other chronic conditions, develop as a result of a variety of factors, including age, genetics, environment, lifestyle, and coexisting medical conditions.



Ways to Lower Risk of Dementia and Alzheimer's The Alzheimer's Association website shared the results of a number of studies regarding ways to lower one's risk of dementia and Alzheimer's. The studies indicate that maintaining strong social connections and keeping mentally active as one ages might lower the risk of cognitive decline. Experts believe that this social and mental stimulation strengthens connections between nerve cells in the brain. Dee Myrick and Kay Fields, our Social Events team, organized a Paducah Bank WOW! Michael Shepherd Short-Term Rehabilitation "I am determined to get better every day!"

Michael Shepherd is our Success Story for the month of June. Mr. Shepherd came to Superior Care after a CVA with paralysis on his right side. Upon admission, Mr. Shepherd required assistance with sitting on the side of the bed and could not walk or stand and was dependent for all care, including an altered diet due to weakness in swallowing.

with standby assistance. He is now talking and able to communicate well with his family and staff. Mr. Shepherd has worked very hard to regain the use of his right arm and leg through the use of patterned electrical stimulation and using the Ominicycle and Sci fit machines. He continues to focus on his balance recovery skills so that he can walk without assistive devices.

He has a positive attitude and works hard every day! "I will do whatever the therapy team wants me to do, because I am determined to get better!" shared Mr. Shepherd or "Miracle Mike" as the therapy team has nicknamed him. Mr. Shepherd explained that his therapists have helped him meet his goals and that everyone has been so helpful! He even shared that his favorite meals are Chef Jason's vegetable soup and the bologna and cheese sandwiches! "I would recommend Superior Care to anyone who needs short-term rehabilitation!"
