Leah Klusch, Executive Director of the Alliance Training Center presented an inservice discussing the results of Superior Care Home's recent Clinical Study of Holistic Continence Care. The results of the study were dramatic and life-improving for the residents. The objective of the study was to overall improve sleep hygiene, which involves the environment, caregiver practice, no medicine to control incontinence, and documentation of sleep. Klusch and Helen Sims, CEO, travelled to Atlanta recently and explained the findings at Domtar's recent annual sales meeting. "Implementing quality care interventions with the support of the high quality absorbent products led to improved clinical outcomes with greater staff and resident satisfaction," Klusch reported. Residents showed an 89% improvement on their balance and strengh Tinetti Scale testing due to longer uninterrupted nighttime sleep cycles. Helping Your Loved One with Dementia

We want to share with you a few tips to help ease the transition of your loved one into our special community. Changes in environment can be challenging for anyone with dementia, and we suggest the following:

- Choose a few familiar items and photos to bring to their room. Your loved one will find comfort being surrounded by familiar items. Do you have photos of family members or pictures of their home? Are there favorite books at home that would bring joy to him/her?
- Provide information about your loved one at your Care Plan Meeting. You have the advantage of knowing your family member's history, his likes and dislikes, so we encourage you to share any and all information with our staff.
- Visit frequently for short intervals Typically, people with memory loss adjust better to environmental changes if a familiar face is near them. Spending time in his/her room and going over photos together is a great way to make them feel comfortable in their new space.
- Encourage participation in activities Our Activities Director, Dee Myrick, does a fantastic job arranging and supervising our twice daily activities. Residents who participate in activities feel engaged creatively and socially, which ultimately benefits their overall comfort level at Superior Care Home.
