We are thrilled to share this amazing success story with you! Claire Hofer came to Superior Care in February after a fall at home resulting in a brain hematoma and a fractured femur. She had a left hip replacement and a craniotomy which left her very weak.

Upon evaluation, her pain level was an 8/10, and her therapy goals were to increase her overall strength and balance and to not have a modified diet. At the present time, she is walking

independently with a standard cane and/or rollator for distances exceeding 250 feet. She is independent with transfers, bed mobility and her activities of daily living. Her pain has resolved, and she is now on a regular diet consistency.

Ms. Hofer shared that all the care professionals-nursing and therapy-have been excellent again, just like the previous time she spent at the Transitions neighborhood. "Sherry, my CNA, is just wonderful. I had the same physical therapist again, Tana, which was great! I also enjoyed my Occupational Therapist, Jennifer! She helped me with my balance, dressing, and even helped me practice doing my laundry!" she chuckled. "You feel the LOVE here!"

Mary Jo Sprouse, Encore Therapy Director shared "Ms. Hofer has attended social activities, and our nursing care team has managed her medical condition very well. She has kept such a positive attitude throughout her stay, and she is a joy to work with!" Ms. Hofer plans to return to Jackson Oaks this week!
